In order to receive credit for an internship, the student must complete 75 hours over the course of the school year. The student may also elect to earn one full credit for completing 150 hours. There are many options for how this credit may be obtained:

- Working for TEN channel productions:  
(TRSB Meetings, Public Hearing, Delib. Session, Awards Night, Graduation)
- Assisting with live productions in PAC:  
(Plays, Concerts, Presentations, other performances)
- Volunteering to other TRHS organizations
  - Helping staff with video productions
  - Helping to videotape/commentate games for sports boosters
- Volunteering your new skills in your own community
  - Town Cable Channels
  - Other Schools of TRSD (pending approval)
  - Town organizations

Student Projects: Interns with TEN \ TimberlaneTV are also encouraged to create their own productions as part of the internship program. Depending on the amount of students involved, there may be monthly news programs and a video yearbook.

Non-Intern Involvement: Students who are interested in television production may not have time to commit to an internship. TimberlaneTV is a student club of TRHS as well as an internship opportunity. Students are welcome to be involved with TimberlaneTV as an intern or simply a member of the organization.

Paid opportunities: Although most of the internship program's time will compensate the student with class credit and work experience, internship students are also eligible to work paid jobs. TEN Channel, Sports boosters, and PAC occasionally offer paying jobs.
