We are currently accepting registrations for kindergarten students. Children who will be 5 by September 30, 2015 are eligible for enrollment. Give the office a call at 382-5554 or stop by and request a registration packet. If you have a child who is currently enrolled in our Integrated Pre School Program, you only need to complete the Full Day/AM/PM preference form that will be sent home in the Danville Delivery. There is a fee, yet to be determined, for the Full Day Kindergarten enrollment. Please join us February 11 (snow date February 18) to hear about our kindergarten offerings.

We are pleased to offer an Integrated Pre School Program again next year. If your child will be 4 by September 30, 2015, he/she may be eligible for school entrance into this program. The Integrated Pre School Program is available in the morning only, Monday through Thursday. There is a fee, yet to be determined,


