Dear Danville Families,

It's time to think about planning for next year! If you will be registering a child for school next year, now is the time to let us know. We are currently accepting on-line preregistrations for Kindergarten students on our website www.danvilleschool.com. Children who will be the age of 5 by September 30th will be eligible for Kindergarten.

If you know of a neighbor who has a child that will be entering Kindergarten in the fall, please let them know it is time to contact us. Help us spread the word! We are holding a Kindergarten information night February 13th in the school gym at 6:00 pm.

Children who will be the age of 4 by September 30th will be eligible for our Pre-K program. We will host an information night for Pre-K in March. More information for Pre-K will be forthcoming.

There will be no school February 26th through March 2nd for the Winter Break.



Educators across our district engaged in a fantastic day of professional development on January 31st learning from Dr. Thomas Hoerr. Dr. Hoerr delivered a keynote to all TRSD staff in the morning, elementary staff

debriefed on his

Success Skills midmorning, and ended
the day with a

Hoerr later gave a

TPAF that wrapped up the day with how we together – the home and school connection – can work to model and develop these skills in our community's children. Working together, we can show kids that good failures - new mistakes - are positive experiences as this is how we learn to get better.

Educators and parents alike must allow these new mistakes to happen, without swooping in too quickly so kids never fail. Navigating the world is something students need to practice. In school, teachers look for appropriate places to hold back from rescuing students, allowing them to persevere and take risks. At home, we must encourage our kids to stick with things when they get hard. Dr. Hoerr shares the best way to do this is to talk about those things and experiences that present a challenge to us as

adults, and to share our experience of working to overcome them.

Dr. Hoerr shares his formative five success skills and strategies for developing them (empathy, integrity, embracing diversity, grit, and self-control) in his book *The Formative Five* that all staff now own. He suggests reading mentor text that model these skills in its characters as a way to begin a conversation with kids about these traits. For book recommendations, please reach out to your child's teacher or myself.

Happy February! We have been very busy in the Art Room! Most classes have been working on three-dimensional art projects.

Kindergarteners learned about <u>clay</u> and coil building. They created their own coil pot using Model Magic.

First Graders learned about <u>Weaving and</u> <u>Complimentary Colors</u>. They are creating their own weaving mat and then turning it into a Weaving Buddy!

The Second Graders are finishing up their <u>Paper Mache</u> Penguins. They are putting on the finishing touches this week.

The Third Graders learned about <u>the</u> <u>artist Georgia O'Keefe</u> and created <u>clay</u> flowers inspired by her work.

The Fourth Graders are finishing up their <u>Plaster Masks</u>. They are adding paint, glitter, feathers and Sequins to make them really special.

The Fifth Graders are working on the creation of their <u>Tape Person</u>. They are working in groups of three or four to construct a full size fifth grade body out of tape!

Our focus in kindergarten for the month of January was polar bears. The students did several experiments and learned facts about these creatures that live in the coldest place on earth. They loved putting blubber on their fingers (Crisco) and sticking their fingers in ice water to find out first-hand how blubber protects polar bears from the cold Arctic Ocean. They were amazed to find out just how big a polar bear paw is! We also had a lively discussion about why polar bears do not hibernate like other bears. Why don't you ask your student about it?

Fourth, and fifth graders learned to sew this month! Each student was responsible to design and create a felt item of their choice. Some students chose to make stuffed animals or pillows, some made pencil pouches or bookmarks. They sketched a design, created a paper pattern, used tools such as pins, needles, and thread. They learned to use one of a couple different stiches. Whether their design was intricate or simple, all of the students worked hard and persevered to see their project through to the end.
