2018 has come and gone and we are now starting our second half of the school year filled with many new beginnings. Grades 1 - 3 have completed their classroom guidance lessons! They have learned about empathy, emotional management strategies and how to solve problems without using blaming words! Full day kindergarten is still in full swing and together with the classroom teachers, students are learning about the Zones of Regulation and Yoga to learn about empathy, how to calm strong feelings and use positive self-talk to get through tough situations.

I'm excited to say, that I am into grades 4 and 5! We have started with reviewing *Empathy* and how *Compassion* is "empathy in action!" We have also added

additional classroom guidance time and have been ending each lesson with a mindfulness listening activity from "MindYeti." (you can practice a MindYeti at home, by visiting: http://www.mindyeti.com)

I hope everyone is keeping warm on these frigid cold days! We have been on fire in the art room these days! Here's a peek on what we've been up to:

Kindergarteners have been busy learning about the best way to use watercolors and the brushes. The Third Graders are entering their unit on Egypt. They learned a great deal about Ancient Egyptian history. Soon they will be embarking on an Ancient Egyptian project about pyramids, hieroglyphics and/or pharaohs.

The Fourth Graders learned about the history of African Baule Masks. They also learned that plaster is made of a pounded rock called Gypsum. Soon they will be creating their own masks using plaster craft and will be given the freedom to design their masks the way they want to.

The Fifth Graders continue working on their Tape People. Most students have figured out the theme of their person. Student's learned how the process works and what they will have to do to work as a team to create these three dimensional masterpieces.


All events take place at the PAC (Timberlane Performing Arts Center). More information will be sent home as the dates approach.

The kindergarteners spent the month of January getting to know the polar bear! We discussed how they are built for the cold air and frozen waters of the Arctic, we discovered how our feet measure up to a bear-sized foot, and we learned how a polar bear's fur helps it to stay hidden on the frozen tundra. We conducted two experiments; one to simulate how blubber keeps a bear warm in the icy water, the other to discover what happens to gummy bears when they are subjected to different solutions (water, salt water, vinegar, and baking soda/water. The students LOVE experiments!

The fifth graders continued their ten week D.A.R.E. program with instructor Office Justine Merced.

Grade Level Library Research:

First grade has been working hard on their Sun, Moon and Stars unit. They are learning to identify key words in a sentence. This is the beginning of notetaking and writing about what they learned. What an amazing job they are doing.

Second grade starting their is independent research project on Our Changing Earth. They have completed their notetaking practice with me in the library using Weather, in Pebble Go as a topic to identify important words. Notetaking will allow them to develop their own evidence. Each student is picking a topic of interest and will be writing and publishing their nonfiction text for our library. Amazing!! **Third grade** are researching New Hampshire. For our "Innovation" project, each third grader will design their square for a students designed quilt. They will be choosing a New Hampshire Landmark or Symbol.
