Dear Danville Families,

I wish you all a safe, happy summer vacation from school. Be sure to take time and reflect on the school year, setting goals for the upcoming year. Please assist your child in practicing school skills in fun ways. Writing letters, keeping a diary, reading daily, and playing math games will help to avoid the "summer slide" educators often refer to. Helping your child exercise their mind daily will allow them to come back to school in the fall ready to learn!

Be sure your summer fun includes spending time outside running, biking, swimming, and making choices using free time in creative ways. Children grow in so many ways; we need to be sure they have time to balance it all.

I offer a friendly reminder about the school dress code. Shoes should be firmly attached to the foot. Flip flops, backless shoes and shoes with heels should be avoided for safety reasons. These types of shoes are difficult to maneuver on the playground and often cause trips and falls.

Students in grades PK-4 will be given a book to take home to read during the summer. Students can read on their own or be read to. Their teacher next year will plan some back to school activities around the books at the start of the school year. The theme for this year's books is Diversity. Please help your child to complete their summer reading assignment.

We are happy to be offering a Title One Summer Camp for those students who participated in Title One during the academic year. Camp will be held at Danville School during July. Paperwork must be returned to school before June 16.

Dear Danville Families,

Let's take a look at what is happening in the art room....

Kindergarteners worked on their symmetry skills when designing some butterflies. They used their knowledge of line and shape to come up with some beautiful designs!

The First Graders learned a bit about Sea Turtles. They created one of their own and learned some new water coloring techniques to paint them in. Students learned two new color words which are Analogous and Intermediate Colors. They used this new found knowledge when painting.

The Second Graders are learning about still life paintings. They are doing an observational drawing of some of my childhood stuffed animals. They are practicing drawing exactly what they see. Once their illustration of the stuffed animal is completed, they are creating fantasy backgrounds surrounding them.

The Third Graders are finishing up their painting on King Tutankhamen. They did a wonderful job creating Egyptian Hieroglyphic writing around this Pharaoh. King Tut is painted in shimmery gold paint and blue to represent the solid gold and blue glass on the original death mask.

The Fourth Graders are beginning to create Marble Runs. This is a three dimensional group project that entails cooperation, craftsmanship and creativity!

The Fifth Graders just finished learning all about Printmaking. They carved linoleum blocks with a design of their choice. Then they printed their block using the necessary tools.

The Second Graders also took a wonderful trip to the Currier Art Museum. It was a great experience for everyone involved!
