What's going on right now in the Art Room?...

K-Students are working on creating a lion using oil pastels and neutral paint colors.

1- Students just finished a unit on puppetry. They are now learning about symmetry in a work of art. They are using color, line, and shape into patterns to create a butterfly.

2-Students are learning about the artist Pablo Picasso. They also learned about warm and cool colors. They are creating a Cityscape with a radial sun.

3-Students have been working on creating a poster of the New Hampshire State Symbol(s). They are using visuals to accurately copy the color and shape of these symbols.

4-Students are working on their Marble Runs. They are working in groups of three to accomplish the same goal of designing a workable run.

5-Students are learning about the artist Henri Matisse. They are embossing tooling foil to make a decorative bird.

The kindergarteners became entomologists last month, learning about bees and flies, butterflies and caterpillars, dragonflies and grasshoppers, and ladybugs and ants. The children participated in a science experiment about pollination, planted marigolds, and drew a picture using a bugs-eye-view. At the end of the unit, I posed 20 questions about what we'd learned to the students as a group and they answered every single one!

Fourth graders put their individual state projects on hold during testing this month and began a project to create their own Overnight Summer Camp. Students chose a theme for their camp and created a camp map, indoor and outdoor games, a daily menu, a special day, their camp motto, logo, and t-shirt, and more.

Fifth graders participated in the DARE Program presented by the Danville Police Department.

Join Band or Strings! Parents of current 2nd, 3rd or 4th grade students: If your child is interested in learning to play an instrument NEXT YEAR, they must sign up NOW! There are NO fall sign ups. (If your child is already a band/string member, they will automatically be enrolled for next year.)

Current 2nd graders are eligible for violin, viola or cello. Current 3rd graders are eligible for violin, viola, cello, flute, clarinet, saxophone, trumpet, trombone, percussion, French horn, oboe.

Come to the Timberlane Performing Arts Center on ONE of the following days: Thursday May 31<sup>st</sup> at 5:00pm OR Saturday June 2<sup>nd</sup> at 8:00am OR Monday June 4th at 5:00pm. Please arrive on time for an informational meeting and plan to stay for 2 hours to let your child try 3 different instruments. Rentals will be offered if you do not already have an instrument that is in good working condition.

This is a free event to help students decide which instrument to play. After you have signed up, there will be three lessons, held on June 11, 12, and 13 at 4pm or 6pm. Plan on attending one lesson each day. The lessons are offered at a reduced rate and will give your child the tools they need to begin learning songs over the summer.

This is a wonderful opportunity to try a band or string instrument before you commit to an instrument. Come join the fun and enjoy beautiful music all summer long!
