#### **Principal News**

Dear Danville Families,

While the spring temperatures are a welcome change to our lives at Danville School, it also brings thoughts of next year's planning, even as we have a solid two months of school left. We are excited to be offering Full Day Kindergarten for the first time, in the Timberlane Schools. We have conducted a screening process to get to know our newest students. If you have not registered your child for kindergarten please call us right away at 382-5554 for planning purposes. Equally important: if you or someone you know in Danville has a child of kindergarten or first grade age for next year that has not previously attended Danville School, please have them call us at the same number. We have openings in our pre-kindergarten program for those children who will be four years old by September 30. Feel free to call the school to learn more about our programs. We pride ourselves on becoming partners with families in the education of their children. Families are their first teachers; we join you in this exciting venture beginning at age four!

Our next school role out for positive behavior is called, "Give me 5!" In order to be available for learning one must be prepared in the following ways:

- 1. Eyes are looking at the speaker
- 2. Mouth is quiet
- 3. Body is still
- 4. Listening with both ears
- 5. Brain is engaged

Please talk to your child about the importance of being prepared to learn.

Danville School will be hosting the Extended Year Program for the Timberlane School District once again. If your child was recommended for this program, you have been contacted and arrangements are well underway.

We are pleased to offer a Summer Title One Camp again this year. This Camp is open to students currently receiving Title One services. We are extending the summer offering to include incoming kindergarten students who could benefit from some practice and instruction before the school year begins.

As the warmer weather approaches, please be reminded of the school dress code. Students must wear shoes/sandals with backs. Flip flops are not allowed. Shorts must be just above the knee in length. Spaghetti strap tops are not considered school appropriate. If students are in school wearing clothing that is not appropriate, they will be asked to call home for a change of clothing or offered an alternative item of clothing to wear.

#### Bicycle Helmet Safety

Bike riding is a lot of fun, but accidents happen. Every year more than 300,000 children go to the emergency room because of bike accidents. The most serious of these injuries are head injuries which often result in brain injuries. In New Hampshire, bicycle helmets are required by law for all persons under the age of 16 years and recommended for all. Wearing one does not mean that your child can ride recklessly but a helmet will provide some protection for his or her face, head, and brain in case of falling.

Bike helmets are so important that the US government has created safety standards for them. Your helmet should have a sticker on it that says it meets standards set by the Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC). Be sure your child wears a helmet with EVERY ride, even short distances. Provide a good example by wearing one yourself when riding. Never allow a child to wear a hat under a helmet and be sure the helmet is neither too small nor too big. A bike helmet should be worn level and cover the forehead. Do not allow the child to tip the helmet back so that the forehead is showing. The straps should always be fastened so that they are snug enough so that the helmet cannot be pulled or twisted around on the child's head. Periodically check the helmet for cracks and other damage or wear and replace any helmet that is compromised.

Many helmets today are lightweight and come in cool colors. Allow your child to choose a safe helmet and he is more likely to use it. Consider one with reflective surfaces to make him more visible to people driving cars.

Teach children to "Use your head, wear a helmet". It is the single most effective safety device available today to reduce head injuries and deaths from bicycle crashes.

Join Band or Strings!

Parents of current 2nd, 3rd or 4th grade students:

If your child is interested in learning to play an instrument NEXT YEAR, they must sign up **NOW**! (IF your child is already a band/string member, they will automatically be enrolled for next year.)

2nd graders are eligible for violin, viola or cello.

3rd graders are eligible for violin, viola, cello, flute, clarinet, saxophone, trumpet, trombone, percussion, French horn, and oboe. (Sorry no piano or guitar).

Please arrive on time for an informational meeting and plan to stay for 2 hours to let your child try 3 different instruments and sign up. (There will be NO fall sign ups.) Rentals will be offered if you do not already have an instrument that is in good working condition.

This is a free event which helps young students decide which instrument best fits their body structure and personality. Experienced instructors will be available to help you and your child with their decision.

After you have signed up, there will be three lessons, held on June 17, 19, and 20 from 4:00 - 5:30pm OR 6:00 - 7:30pm. The lessons are offered at a reduced rate and will give your child the information they need to begin learning songs over the summer. This is a wonderful opportunity to try a band or string instrument before you commit to an instrument. Come join the fun and enjoy beautiful music all summer long!
