We are trying something new this year to celebrate Halloween. At the suggestion of PTA members we will be having a parade; actually two! The first parade will be Thursday, October 27 for students in PK and AM Kindergarten at 10:30. The second parade will be October 28 at 2:15 for full day kindergarten through grade 5 students. Costumes are optional. If your child chooses to bring a costume to school, they will be asked to put it on over their school clothes. There will be no make-up, masks, or weapons allowed. Costumes are not allowed on the bus. Children will need to carry their costumes to and from school. If you would like to watch the parade, please plan to be on the playground at the start times. We will walk around on the pavement and will be coming out of the cafeteria door. Let's hope for nice weather!

We are pleased to report that enhanced security measures in the way of doorbell intercom systems have been installed at all district buildings and will be activated the week of October 10th. This means that all front exterior doors to all district buildings will remain locked at all times.

You will be asked to identify yourself and the purpose of your visit. You will then be buzzed into the building to check in with the building receptionist as is done now.

This increased security measure was recommended by the New Hampshire Department of Homeland Security and Emergency Management and is intended for the safety and security of your children and the staff.

## Assistant Principal News

Thank you to students, staff, and families for a warm and easy transition to the Timberlane Regional School District, and this fabulous school in Danville. I am pleased to have met so many supportive community members. Our students model after you and have done a great job teaching me Danville's Core Values – Respect, Responsibility and Pride.

We have had a busy start to the year. Teachers are implementing year 2 of our math program EnVisions, digging deeper into our curriculum documents, and rolling out our Responsive Classroom Framework as a support to behavior and instructional systems. Morning Meeting is a common practice in all classrooms. Students and teachers gather together to greet, share and prepare for a successful day socially and academically.

Our first STAR assessment results have been sent home. This test is a computer-adaptive test which provides information for instruction relative to student needs, both for intervention and enrichment. Teachers will be discussing the first STAR benchmark during parent teacher conferences in November, but please reach out with any questions you would like answered before that.

Be on the lookout for Blizzard Bags. Yes, it is only October, but we are prepared for everything here in NH. To know for sure that a snow day has been designated as an Online Learning/Blizzard Bag Day, listen to the "No School" alert message. The message will indicate that it is an Online Learning/Blizzard Bag Day. During an official Online Learning/Blizzard Bag Day, your child's teacher (in grades 3-5) will be online to view, comment, and support students during the hours of 10:00 am - 2:00 pm. An Online Learning/Blizzard Bag Day will not be called in the case of wide-spread power outage. Students in grades K-2, and those in the upper grades with the paper copy option, are asked to bring their work to school the next day. We want the Online Learning/Blizzard Bag Day to be a great success. It is important that all students participate. In order for the day to count as a school day the district needs 80% participation. It is our goal at Danville Elementary to have 100% each Blizzard Day.

## 10 Steps to Your Healthiest School Year Ever!

1. Start off strong with a healthy breakfast. A good breakfast provides energy and will help keep you alert and attentive in class. Highly sugared foods leave you feeling tired soon after eating. Remember: Your school performance is directly related to what you eat!

2. *Drink plenty of water*. Water is the best fluid to stay hydrated without the added sugar found in some juice and soft drinks. Also, remember to drink the

recommended amount of reducedfat milk or milk alternative.

3. Don't forget to wash your hands often. Keep hands away from your face, mouth, and nose where germs can enter your body.

4. *Boost your immune system.* Get plenty of sleep and, eat colorful fruits and vegetables every day. Think variety and rainbow colors!

5. *Eat a nutritious and yummy lunch.* Choose foods from all the food groups. Different food groups supply our bodies with energy to think, move, and grow. Make healthy choices from the daily menus, or pack a healthy lunch from home.

6. *Cut back on sugar and salty snacks.* Limit sodas, sport drinks, candy, chips, and ice cream – they add on extra calories, can harm your teeth, and leave you feeling tired. Need ideas for a snack at school? Ask the nurse!

7. Enhance your brain performance. Exercise, play memory games, do crossword puzzles, and eat brain foods like berries, cold water fish, and nuts. Just say "NO" to fast food and enjoy a home cooked meal together at least four nights a week.

8. Get at least 30 minutes of exercise every day – at recess and at home. Go for a daily walk with a friend, a parent, or your pet. Exercise helps our bodies to be strong, flexible, and resilient.

9. *Do your homework every day after school.* It's so important to be prepared!

10. Turn off the TV and video games at least one hour prior to bedtime. Take time to relax, take a bath or shower, brush your teeth, and pack up for the morning!

Science. Technology. Engineering. Art. Mathematics.

The Kindergarteners have conducted several science experiments during their time with me this September. We explored what objects would sink, and which would swim. We explored apples and made an apple craft using vinegar, baking soda, and food coloring. We discovered the power of force by using a catapult to send a cow (ping pong ball) over the moon. Finally we learned how leaves change color and created leaf rubbings to investigate the structure of a leaf and how it drinks in water.

Third, fourth, and fifth graders have been busy using teamwork to achieve success in several S.T.E.A.M. related tasks. They worked together to create the tallest spaghetti tower possible able to hold up a marshmallow, built index card houses to keep the Three Little Pigs safe from the wind of the Big Bad Wolf, and finally created a paper airplane that could glide through a target carrying the most cargo. The winning team was a group of fifth graders who successfully flew \$11.60 through the target without losing any cargo!

## Enrichment News-Grade 5 Trip to Chase Ocean Engineering Lab By Cindy Wood

On Friday, September 16, the Danville grade five students attended Ocean Discovery Day at the UNH Chase Ocean Engineering There the students explored Laboratory. topics such as 3-D topography, ROV use to explore our oceans and the ocean floor, Wave Tank and energy from waves, Oysters, Squid Dissecting, Characteristics of Water. Seaweeds and their importance, Knot Tying, Horseshoe Crabs, Flinking - how a submarine sinks and rises, Aquaculture, Estuaries, Sea Changes and Weather Extremes and so much more. The purpose of our trip was two-fold to students to future expose career opportunities and to make them aware of the importance of marine environments (oceans, lakes, rivers, ponds...).

Before the trip, students explored books on



many of the topics available for exploring on September 16. This created curiosity. left them with questions to ponder generated and excitement about would what they learn on September 16. While at Chase Engineering Ocean Lab, the students were tasked with finding a topic that

interested them. Once they returned to school on September 16 they were given the rest of the afternoon to settle on a topic and begin research to learn more about their topic choice. Over the next few weeks, students worked

individually or in small teams to learn more about their interest. They created



posters as a teaching tool and then prepared an oral presentation to share with their grade five friends and classmates.

The next time you are at school, be on the lookout for some amazing posters that will teach about ocean engineering, water characteristics, ROVs, humpback whales, squid and many other topics.

I also want to thank all of the chaperones who attended the trip with us. This support allowed the students to work in small groups while on the field trip; learning was tailored to each group's interests.
