Dear Danville Families,

Welcome to a new school year. This is always an exciting time for educators and students alike. We enjoy getting to meet new friends and to re-connect with old friends. The students and teachers are in great spirits. Thank you for preparing your children for a busy and productive year. We are honored to share this school year with your children.

We will continue to strengthen our school culture by practicing positive behavioral interventions and supports (PBIS). We will teach students expected behaviors at monthly assemblies. Our mascot, Mr. Hawke, will be visiting the school from time to time. Mr. Hawke doesn't speak but offers friendly waves to those he meets on the playground or in the hallways! Children will earn feathers for demonstrating Respectful and Responsible behaviors that will make us all feel full of Pride!

Student assessments are the evidence teachers use to inform instructional practices. Teachers gather this evidence often and in a variety of ways. Teachers will share their evidence when

they meet with you throughout the year. We are also asking our students to recognize their role in learning. Research tells us when students are invested in their learning they will be more successful.

All elementary schools in the Timberlane School District are using a new math program called enVision by Pearson. This program does a fine job of balancing foundational numeracy skills, concepts and problem solving, technology, and 21st century learning. We believe the rigor and structure of this program will help develop strong mathematical thinkers. This resource is aligned with the NH College and Career Ready Standards. Your teachers will be sending home weekly letters to inform you of skills being taught and practiced. Engage your children by having conversations about what they are learning in math. Ask them to teach you!

I welcome new faces to our staff. Mr. Brian Shawley is our Assistant Principal. Mrs. Jill Dion joins us as our Speech Language Pathologist. Mrs. Kelly Lennon is a third grade teacher and Ms. Merrill is a first grade teacher. Please stop by and introduce yourself when you are in the building.

Dear parent/ guardian,

As many of you already know the School Nurse does hearing and vision screenings on our pre-school or grade 1 students, and it is again repeated in the 4th grade. I am excited to tell you that we will be having the Lion's Club come in and perform a vision screening on all the students (except for our pre-school children who are not here on Friday mornings) here at the elementary school. I will examine the preschool children on an alternate day. The Lion's Club has purchased a machine for school screenings which is capable of providing us with some valuable, quite accurate information. The test only takes approximately one minute per student, therefore an entire class can be screened in less than 30 minutes. We will doing this on Friday September 18th.

In next week's Danville Delivery please look for information regarding the Ronald McDonald Mobile Dental Van which will be coming to our school on September 28th. I would ask that you review the document, complete it, and return it to me ASAP. The service is provided for:

- ❖ A student who does not have a regular dentist.
- ❖ A student who has NH Medicaid and does not have a regular dentist.
- ❖ A student that does not have any dental insurance.

This is a terrific program and I hope that everyone who is eligible take advantage of this! The forms need to be returned in advance (of the clinic) so that the clinicians have an opportunity to review the student's medical history portion of the document.

Counselor's Corner

Welcome Back Danville School Family and Friends!

Hello and welcome to the first 2015-2016
Counselor Corner! I am back from maternity
leave, where I spent the last couple of
month's home with my new little boy. While
it was hard to leave my little guy, the
Danville staff and students (your children!)
made it easier for me to be back. It was so
great to see their smiling faces and feel
their excitement for the new school year!
It's going to be a great year!

As we begin the 2015-2016 school year, parents and teachers often find that some students have a difficult time transitioning back to school. We need to remember that children need time to transition into new routines. They often need reassurance that things will get easier and that there are people to help them get through this tough time. "New School Year Jitters" are to be expected, but there are ways we can support our children/students to get through them.

Tip: Easing the New School Year Jitters

The Fear: "I don't want to be away from you for so long!"

Start by acknowledging your child's concern at the bus stop or at car drop-off time. Acknowledge that your child is feeling nervous by saying "I know you're scared to be without me," or "I know you're feeling nervous." Explain when you'll be back by telling them which activity they can plan to see you after, such as music or science class (the teacher can let you know what the end-of-day schedule will be). Children have an easier time understanding this instead of using specific time.

If your child had a teary goodbye, refrain from mentioning it again later on. Instead, ask them to tell you about one fun thing they did that day. Even if you were thinking about their tears, they most likely forgot them hours ago ③. Please feel free to contact your child's teacher or school counselor at any time, to find out how your child's day went.

All events take place at the PAC (Timberlane Performing Arts Center). More information will be sent home as the dates approach.




Hello Everyone!

PARENTS RIGHT-TO- KNOW

Title I, Part A of ESEA (The No Child Left Behind Act of 2001)



Parent's Right To Know - (Section 1111(h)(6)(A-C))

<u>Qualifications:</u> At the beginning of each school year, a LEA that receives Title I funds must notify parents of each student attending any Title I school that the parents may request, and that agency will provide the parents on request (and in a timely manner) information regarding the professional qualification of the student's classroom teachers, including at minimum the following:

- Whether the teachers has met State qualifications for the grade levels and subject areas in which the teacher provides instruction;
- Whether the teacher is teaching under emergency or other professional status that the State has waived;
- ♦ The degree major of the teacher and any other graduate certification or degree held by the teacher and the field of discipline of the certification or degree; and
- Whether the child is provided services by paraprofessionals and if so their qualifications.

<u>Additional Information</u> - A school that receives Title I funds <u>must provide to each</u> individual parent –

- Information on the level of achievement the child has made on all state assessments; and
- ◆ Timely notice that the parent's child has been assigned or taught for 4 or more consecutive weeks by a teacher who is not highly qualified.

<u>Format</u> – The notice and information provided to parents under this paragraph shall be in an understandable and uniform format and, to the extent practicable, provided in a language that the parents can understand.

Title I Program September 10, 2002
