School Counseling News

Early December marked the halfway point of second quarter and parents may view their student's progress on their Parent Powerschool accounts. If you need assistance, please call the School Counseling Office. We encourage seniors to keep up their grades in the coming weeks as mid-year grade reports will be sent to all colleges that students have already applied to.

A large percentage of our seniors are already awaiting college decisions, and college acceptance letters for Fall 2018 are beginning to be received by our students. Keep up the good work Seniors! We love hearing about your success so keep us posted when those decisions come in! Also, make sure you see your counselor if you need help with additional applications, or if you are still working on finishing up your first applications.

Seniors, do not forget to be checking the scholarship listing on Naviance since we are receiving information on new scholarships every day. Seniors are advised to submit applications for scholarships they seem to be a match for. All seniors are encouraged to submit the Timberlane Scholarship application, now available on the school website. A completed application will make applicants eligible for over 40 local scholarships. This application, as well as other scholarship resources, are posted on the Guidance page on our website.

On December 4th we began the post high school career and college planning process with our sophomores. Counselors met with all 10th grade students in the library computer lab to introduce students to Naviance Succeed, our college and career readiness software program. Students completed a Career Interest Profile and Career Cluster Finder, and learned how to use additional features such as College Match. Students identified three career clusters they were interested in and this list will be used when inviting speakers for our Sophomore Career Day to be held on April 17th. Sophomore parents are invited to attend our **Sophomore Parent Night** on January 30, 2017 at 6:30 PM in the Cafeteria for an introduction to the Naviance software program, career surveys and early college planning tips.

PSAT scores were posted to student's College Board accounts beginning on December 12th. If students do not have an account then they will receive a paper report. Students have been encouraged to create college board accounts so they can upload their results to Kahn Academy for targeted personalized SAT practice. If you have any questions please contact the School Counseling office. As part of the NH state testing program, SAT's will be administered to all juniors in school on March 21st.

Socktober: A sock collection drive for the homeless



For the entire month of October, Students of Service held a sock collection drive, "Socktober," as a way to collect socks for the homeless. In a partnership with other schools across the state, the goal was to collect 20,000 pairs of socks in total when adding up the other participating schools. SOS ran a competition for the Timberlane staff by creating teams to see which department(s) could bring in the most donations. Team 2 which consisted of the School Counseling offices, Health and PE yielded the most pairs with 235 pairs of socks donated. In addition, 8 year old local boy scout,

Shaun Ingram, collected 325 pairs of socks and the school received a very generous donation from Timberland of 600 pairs of socks. the Timberlane community was able to collect 2,000 pairs of socks! The socks were donated to the Lazurus House in early November.

Development Officer Ellen Bedrosian explained how the donation will impact the community, "This donation will serve our guests at Lazarus House on many levels. For those who come to our soup kitchen every day in all kinds of weather seeking comfort, nourishment, a shower and a fresh pair of socks. For those we serve from our soup van that goes out on the streets of Lawrence during the coldest months of January, February, and March on Friday and Sunday nights – top item requested – clean socks."

Socks are actually one of the items that most quickly fly off the shelves in shelters. "When you don't have access to all the comforts of home, washing your clothing sometimes is not an option. Because of Timberlane's caring and generous spirit with this incredible donation of 2000 pairs of socks we will be able to touch and comfort hundreds if not thousands of lives. Thank you for being there for our guests. We are so incredibly grateful."

For over thirty years, Mealey's Meals has been serving the Timberlane community to help district families in need. During this holiday season, Mealey's Meals will help over 100 families and over 200 children. In order to help meet the needs of those in our community, Students of Service, Student Council and district staff partnered up to run several fundraisers and drives.

Each year, TRHS holds a classroom coin collection drive competition to help raise money for Mealey's Meals and the winner of the competition wins a free pancake breakfast. This year, the competition was held for both A and B day classes and due to the generosity of four classes across those days, they all won a free breakfast cooked by Mrs. Michele Monti and her cooking class. Student Council sponsored two huge Mealey's Meals fundraisers- the raffle baskets and Gingerbread House Making night. This year, we had over 30 baskets being raffled off filled with amazing items.
