

Timberlane Drama Honor Society Eligibility

In order to be considered for inclusion in DHS (Drama Honor Society) students must have ten participation credits in theatre related activities. Once a student has 10 credits, he or she can submit his or her credits to the Timberlane Players' Director for verification. The student must also write a two-page essay that talks about what being part of the Timberlane Drama Program has taught him or her.

DHS Credits form: In order to be eligible for DHS you need to have at least 10 credits. Credits are assessed in the following manner:

Full Credit:

One full credit for each major acting role. This means a lead role: students should double check with the Director to make sure whether a role in which they performed is a lead or supporting role.

One full credit if you were assistant director or stage manager for a show.

One full credit for each theatre course taken: Improv, Playwriting, Intro to Theatre and Advanced Acting.

One full credit for each year as a member of the Milkmen.

Half Credit:

One half credit for each supporting role. Students need to check with the Director to make sure if a role was a supporting or lead role.

One half credit for stage crew for a show.

Quarter Credit:

One quarter credit for each 24-hour and/or one act play involvement.

One quarter credit for art night involvement.

One quarter credit for any workshop attended relating to theatre.

Each credit will only be awarded if a student has successfully completed a class or workshop. If a student needs to drop his or her involvement in a production, he or she will not receive credit. There are some extenuating circumstances due to illness, but credit will be awarded only if participation in a production goes beyond 60% of the production run.
