AP Testing began on May 7th. Students enrolled in AP courses are required to take the AP exam, which begin on Monday, May 7th and run through May 18th. Students taking morning exams should report to their testing room by 7:20 AM. Students taking afternoon exams should report to their testing room by 11:30 AM. SAT score reports have been posted to College Board accounts for all Juniors that took the SAT in March and have college board accounts. Juniors having difficulty accessing their scores can stop by and see their counselor for assistance.

As part of the State Testing program, all Juniors will be taking Science tests May 21 - 24. Students will test on either A or B Days on two of the four days scheduled. The new state test replaces the Science NECAPS taken in the past and will be administered on-line over a two-day period. Students will receive their testing schedule and room assignments after vacation.

Sophomore students participated in our fourth annual Career Day on April 17. Students were able to learn about different careers from professionals employed in those career fields. Many of our presenters were alumni of Timberlane and were excited to share their career experiences with our students.

A Visit with NH Supreme Court Chief Justice John Broderick

Former NH Supreme Court Court Chief Justice John Broderick will visit Timberlane to teach about Dartmouth-Hitchcock's Five Signs of Suicide and how to REACT to save a life. The R.E.A.C.T. campaign provides students, parents and communities throughout New Hampshire and Vermont tips in dealing with signs of emotional suffering, and resources for support. This effort is in response to the five signs of emotional suffering identified by Change Direction, a national organization dedicated to changing the culture and communication surrounding mental illness. Justice Broderick will be coming to Timberlane High School on May 15th, to speak with all students about Suicide Prevention and how to R.E.A.C.T.: Recognize, Express, Act now, Care, and Text "signs".

Justice Broderick will also be available for a community presentation for parents and others, on Wednesday May 16th, from 6:30-8:00PM in the TRHS Cafe. This presentation will be sponsored by SoRock Coalition for Healthy Youth (SoRocknh.org) and the Georgie Boy Grant, a Community Prevention initiative.

Alcohol Awareness Month

Timberlane Celebrates Alcohol Awareness Month. Timberlane Peer Outreach has been very active this month in promoting awareness of risks associated with underage drinking with Prom and Graduation season just around the corner. In addition to creating a very informative bulletin board, they also brought the "Drunk and Distracted Driving Simulators" from Dartmouth's Injury Prevention Center, and other awareness activities to the Cafe. In addition, reaching out to parents and adults in the community, they participated again the annual Buyer Beware "Sticker Shock" campaign warning adults not to provide alcohol to minors, or face up to a year in jail and up to a \$2,000 fine. Thank you to our business prevention partners at Shaw's and Market Basket. Lastly, Peer Outreach joined forces with our Life of an Owl program and Plaistow Police and Fire Departments to create a new "Fatal Reality" video that will be shown to our senior class the day before prom.



Timberlane Dominates at Harvard

From February 22 through February 25, a delegation of 11 Timberlane students joined over a thousand students from all over the world and attended the Harvard Model Congress conference in Boston, MA. At the conference, students took on the roles and perspectives of lawmakers in Washington and addressed some of the most pertinent issues of our time, including biomedical engineering, pharmaceutical regulation and availability, governmental oversight, bioterrorism, and space mining. This next generation of leaders worked across party lines and developed real solutions to the world's issues. Timberlane's delegation received six awards (proportionally more than any other school at the conference), including three Best Delegate awards: Cameron Magner (SR), Bryan



Lavoie (SR) and Samantha Blais (SO), and three Honorable Mentions: Luke Taylor (JR), Kyle Duffy (SO), and Nick Longchamp (SO). The entire delegation then addressed New Hampshire's government at the Youth and Government conference on March 17 and April 6-7 at the Concord State House. Congratulations to the entire delegation!

Understanding the Faces of Addiction



During the month of March, the Health 2 students had the opportunity to hear from two community resources regarding the opioid crisis. Ken Goodwin, a substance abuse counselor at Hampstead Hospital spoke to the Health 2 students and shared his perspective on treatment services for addiction. He discussed his career path as well as the ins and outs of the treatment experience. The students engaged in a rich discussion with questions and answers that left them understanding the human side and personal story that each addict carries with them. and mock treatment activity. These students also heard from Jon Lovett, who is a former Timberlane graduate and coach, and currently the Manager of the EMS Department at Lawrence General Hospital. Students were able to learn more about opiates, the science of addiction and chemical changes in the brain, as well as the implications and community effects of addiction on EMS services and personnel that care for overdose calls. Health teachers, Katie Murphy and Mark Pasquini feel strongly that the partnership with community and school resources, together with parents can truly make a difference in helping our students understand this drug epidemic and make healthy choices for a bright future.

Trip to France during April Vacation 2018

Nine students and Madame Runnells travelled for 10 days during the 2018 April vacation visiting Paris, Avignon, Nimes, and Carcassonne in France and then spent two and a half days in Barcelona, Spain. Some of the highlights were visiting Notre Dame, the Eiffel Tower, the Versailles Palace, and the Louvre in Paris, the Palais des Papes (a medieval gothic palace of the popes) in Avignon, the roman amphitheater and the



"Maison Carrée" (the façade of a roman temple) in Nimes, as well as the fortress of Carcassonne also dating back to medieval times. In Barcelona we watched Flamenco dancing, attended an art class, and viewed the Sagrada Familia (church in progress of Antoni Gaudi) as well as the Park Guell (decorated by Antoni Gaudi.) Most everyone returned with a tan as the weather was warm and sunny every day.
