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News from the Health Office

To prevent the spread of germs, including COVID-19, the Center for Disease Control recommends washing hands with soap and water whenever possible because it reduces the amount of many types of germs and chemicals on hands. However, if soap and water are not readily available, using a hand sanitizer can help you avoid getting sick and spreading germs to others.

 Choose hand sanitizers with at least 60% alcohol (often listed on the label as ethanol, ethyl alcohol, isopropanol, or 2-propanol).

 Properly apply alcohol-based sanitizer by rubbing the gel over all surfaces of your hands and fingers until your hands are dry.

• Rinsing or wiping off the alcohol-based hand sanitizer before it is dry may not work well against germs.

Swallowing alcohol-based hand sanitizers can cause alcohol poisoning. Keep them out of reach of young children and supervise their use.
Keep alcohol-based hand sanitizer out of your eyes.

• Supervise young children when they use alcohol-based hand sanitizer.

Alcohol-based hand sanitizer is not designed to clean or disinfect surfaces.

• Don't store alcohol-based hand sanitizer above 105°F (for example, it should not be stored in a car during the summer months).

Attention Class of 2022 Parents and Students:

Senior photos submissions are due to the yearbook by October 22!! If you had a photo taken by someone other, then Geskus you need to submit it to the yearbook so we can include it in the 2022 yearbook. If we don't receive a photo by October 22 the students ID photo will be used. If we do not have an ID photo on file, we will not have a photo for them to include in the senior section.

Things to keep in mind when submitting a photo.

The portrait must be a head shot <u>(include head and upper torso</u>). Full body pictures will be cropped to meet this regulation. Also, horizontal poses do not make for good selections for the yearbook as they may not look as intended when cropped. <u>Props are not allowed</u>, e.g., musical instruments, athletic equipment/gear, pets, cars and etc. TRHS Dress Code must be followed, e.g., no hats, sleeveless shirts, revealing tops, etc. Students must submit a digital photo. <u>The photo</u> <u>must be in JPEG format, I MB resolution or better</u>, and have standard photo aspect ratio, e.g., Sin. x 7in.
