News from the Health Office

What are the benefits of flu vaccination? Prevent Flu This Fall and Winter. It is likely that flu viruses and the virus that causes COVID-19 will both spread this fall and winter. Healthcare systems could be overwhelmed treating both patients with flu and patients with COVID-19. This means getting a flu vaccine during the 2021-2022 year is more important than ever. While getting a flu vaccine will not protect against COVID-19, there are many important benefits, such as:

- · Flu vaccines have been shown to reduce the risk of flu illness and hospitalization.
- · Flu vaccination can keep you from getting sick with the flu.
- · Flu vaccination can reduce the risk of flu-associated hospitalization for children, working-age adults, and older adults.
- · Flu vaccination is an important preventive tool for people with chronic health conditions.
- · Flu vaccination has been shown in several studies to reduce the severity of illness in people who are vaccinated but still get sick.
- Getting a flu vaccine can also save healthcare resources for the care of patients with COVID-19.
- · During seasons when the flu vaccine viruses are similar to circulating flu viruses, the flu vaccine has been shown to reduce the risk of having to go to the doctor with flu by 40 to 60 percent.
- · Protect yourself from the flu; even healthy people need a flu vaccine.

News from School Counseling

Sophomore and junior students who took the PSAT on October 16 will be notified via email in mid- December that their score report is available through the College Board. Students are encouraged to create a College Board account if they have not already done so. It is important that students do not create more than one account. Please click <u>HERE</u> for additional information on how to access your scores. If you need assistance, please see your school counselor.

Last month we held a "Financial Aid" webinar with the New Hampshire of Higher Education Assistance Foundation (NHHEAF) for our senior parents. This webinar focused on the Federal Financial Aid Form (FAFSA) and types of available aid. In addition, funding options, scholarship searches and the importance of

deadlines were also discussed. If you were unable to make the webinar an email was sent to all senior parents with a link to the presentation. This link will only be available for 30 days.

November 15 and Dec. 1 are popular early college application deadlines. Seniors please be sure to complete your transcript request forms and submit them to the school counseling office.

In the spring of 2022, the SAT will be administered to all juniors as part of the NH state assessment program at the high school during a school day. Additional information will be provided as time nears. SAT prep is still available at: https://www.khanacademy.org/sat.

Lastly, School Counseling has been busy scheduling college visits and will continue to schedule colleges throughout the year to meet with interested students. All juniors and seniors should continue to check Naviance for updates.

GAPP Trip Cancelled

Due to increased COVID activity in central Europe, we are cancelling the planned exchange to Germany this spring. We will try and make the trip happen again in June 2023. Students may begin to sign up for the trip in June of 2022.
