 - Have visited the colleges they are interested in
 - ☐ Have taken SATs/ACTs or signed up for next test.

Community College & 2 Year Schools

- Have agreements with 4 year schools (NH Transfer Program)
- Visit Schools! Many options available!
- **▶** DO NEED:
 - To fill out application (available on each school's website)
 - To apply for financial aid (Fill out FAFSA)
 - To meet with admissions counselor to discuss courses & testing (Accuplacer)
- ► DO NOT NEED:
 - SAT scores
 - Letters of Recommendation

More Testing...

- ▶ If your child would like to improve their SAT or ACT score, they could take:
 - November 3rd SAT (Registration Deadline October 5th)
 - December 1st SAT (Registration Deadline November 2nd)
 - October 27th ACT (Registration Deadline September 28th)

- SAT/ACT scores <u>must</u> be sent directly to the colleges from your College Board or ACT account.
 - Students receive 4 free score reports with each registration. If you do not take advantage of this during the registration process you will have to pay to send your scores to your colleges.

Deadlines

- Early Action (non binding) & Early Decision (binding)
 - November/December
- Regular Decision
 - January/February
- Rolling Admission
 - The earlier the better, first come first serve for money and program space.
- **Nursing students** Deadlines are often different than regular student admission.



Details: Common Application

- 1) Add Schools
- 2) Complete Common App section (goes to all schools)
 - Personal
 - Family
 - Education
 - Activities
 - Writing (College Essay)
- 3) Complete Individual School Questions
 - Sign FERPA/ Manage Recommenders
 - Writing supplements if required

Details: The College Essay

- We worked with students in the their junior English Courses.
- ▶ 1–2 Pages.
- Competitive schools may have more than one essay.
- Have an English teacher/educator review.
- PROOFREAD!
- Upload into CommonApp

- Do get creative how can you stand out?
- Do answer the question. Be direct.
- Do answer honestly.
- Do reveal personal information, but have boundaries.
- Do begin early!

Details: Additional Application Supplements

- Should I sign-up for an optional college interview?
 - Choosing to interview demonstrates your interest
 - The interview lets you learn more
 - The interview allows the college to put a face to the numbers
- If interested in a music/art major there may be additional application procedures
 - Portfolio
 - Auditions

Details: Letters of Recommendation

- Students should ask teachers in person (1-2 teachers recommended)
- Request teacher in Naviance, write note including deadline.
- Follow up with thank you note
- Outside recommenders: can be added through Common App

Details: Requesting Transcripts

Request Transcript on Naviance

 Select "manage transcript" under "colleges I am applying to" and request transcripts for the schools that the student is ready to send applications

Transcript Request Form

- Available in counseling office and on the School Counseling website
- Indicate school/deadline/recommender for each school
- Remember: Form must be handed in at least 1 week prior to deadline.

Parent Signature needed (if not 18)

Note: We automatically send mid-year reports to all schools a student has applied to. The final report will be sent to the school the student indicates on their senior survey.

\$\$\$ Scholarships \$\$\$

- 3 types of Scholarships
 - Upon Admission (Merit)
 - National/Regional
 - Local
- Timberlane Scholarship Due in February
 - Approximately 40 local scholarships covered under one application
 - Available on Naviance (posted in December)
- Students can view links to scholarship information through their Naviance account.
 - Colleges → Scholarships & Money Scholarship List

CSS Profile

WHAT is the PROFILE? The PROFILE is an online application that collects information used by certain colleges and scholarship programs to award institutional aid funds. (All Federal funds are awarded based on the FAFSA, available after Oct. 1 at fafsa.ed.gov.) Some colleges may require additional information, such as tax returns or an institutional application. If your parents are divorced, some colleges will also require your noncustodial parent to complete the Noncustodial PROFILE.
