COLLEGE FAIR

The Timberlane Guidance Department is excited for their annual College Fair being held in the TRHS gymnasium on Monday, September 15th and Tuesday, September 16th from 9:00 - 11:00 AM. One of the biggest decisions a student will make in high school is determining their post secondary plan. It is our hope that by inviting these representatives to TRHS we are adding another layer of awareness to the post-secondary planning process for our students. Between 100 - 125 colleges, universities, technical schools and branches of the US military are expected to participate in the program. Junior and Senior students will attend both dates in order to meet with different representatives over the two day period.

Junior and Senior Student Ambassadors have been selected to welcome and help the representatives and their peers during the fair. Although parking will be limited, we would like to invite junior and senior parents to attend. College representatives are eager to speak directly with students and parents. This is an opportunity to interact one on one with admissions representatives to discuss admissions requirements, program offerings, and financial aid and scholarship options.

FROM THE DESK OF...

Academic Dean of Attendance, William P. Mealey MEd.

Welcome back. As the new school year begins, the administrative staff is fully energized to help each of our students strive toward reaching their potential. To this end, our team has been organized in a way that best provides more immediate and direct support and assistance in the needed. The Academic specific areas Attendance position was created last year to support Student Services. I have worked in the high school for 15 of the last 17 years in many roles throughout special education. I also attended school here at Timberlane, and grew up in Plaistow; so I have many deep connections within the community. I will be working closely with Student Services, Guidance, and the Special Education Department. As a team we report to Mrs. Susan Rasicot, the Director of Student Services for the District.

Our plan is to offer a heightened level of support to our students in regards to attendance. The New Hampshire Department of Education has identified that attendance and quality teachers are the two most impactful factors in a child's education. In support of this fact, the state has passed a law that does not allow students under the age of 18 to drop out of school. Additionally, the state has tightened the laws regarding truancy. It is important that you know and understand that the state considers any student "truant" after they have missed 10 (unverified) half days of school! That is only five full days of unverified absences! As you may already know from last year, our school has strived to support this philosophy through a revised attendance policy. We have examined these policies this summer in an effort to continue to improve attendance concerns. The attendance policies and procedures are detailed in the Student Handbook which can be found on the high school's website. I will do my best to keep students aware of their absences in order to keep them on course towards graduation.

Student Driving and Safety

Over the past week there have been several incidences of irresponsible driving on the campus.
