This past Sunday, veterans and their families, along with many members of the district, gathered at the Performing Arts Center for the ninth annual Timberlane Community Band Veteran's Day Concert. Honored guests speakers included Governor Maggie Hassan, Retired Lt. Colonel Kevin Major, a Timberlane alumni, and Adjutant Major General William Reddel III.

While sitting in the audience, I found myself highly impressed with our community for hosting such a special event. I was especially proud of our district music director, Mr. Anthony DiBartolomeo, music educators, John Mainella and Kurt Schweiss, technical director, Steven Rugoletti, the students, graduates, and community members who performed, as well as several other of the gifted district music department members who contribute to the community band. 
