Juniors to Take the New SAT for State Accountability Testing

On March 2, 2016 all TRHS juniors will be taking the new SAT. The NH Department of Education has chosen to replace the Smarter Balanced and NECAP assessments that were given in the past with the redesigned SAT test for all juniors in New Hampshire. The new SAT test is fully aligned to the NH College and Career Readiness Standards and our district's newly designed curricula in Math, English, Social Studies and Science. Changes to this test include assessing math standards to

include Trigonometry, assessing vocabulary and structures for English Language Arts through context and making the essay portion optional. All students will be given the Math and Reading/Writing free of charge and will have the option to take the essay.

In an effort to help students prepare for the test, our school will provide practice opportunities both in and out of school:

- Administration is working closely with our teachers in all departments to help them understand the changes to the new SAT and to incorporate weekly practice in their classrooms that models SAT style questions.
- Free SAT prep courses are being offered through our Evening Division. The courses run January 5th through March 1st. Class size is limited and registration is on a first-come, first-serve basis; students should see their school counselor to sign up.
- The PTSA and administration will be hosting a Coffee with the Principal on January 12th at 7 pm at the PAC to help parents better understand the test and how to support their students.
- There are a number of resources and practice assessments as well as information on the test that can be found at https://collegereadiness.collegeboard.org/sat?navld=gh-nsat.
- Students that took the PSAT in October will be able to personalize their practice by linking their PSAT test results to the Kahn Academy website for targeted SAT prep (see more information below). For students that have not taken the PSAT, practice tests are available on Kahn Academy in order to generate their own targeted SAT prep at www.kahnacademy.org

Financial Aid Resources

A representative from the nonprofit New Hampshire Higher Education Assistance Foundation (NHHEAF) was here on December 7th to discuss the types of financial aid available for parents and students, how to apply, understanding federal aid programs, managing the cost, and searching for scholarships. If you missed the presentation, you can review the slideshow on the NHHEAF website along with a wealth of other information and resources designed to help parents and students through planning and financing a secondary education. In the spring, we will host NHHEAF once again for their presentation on Understanding the College Financial Aid Award Letter on March 30th, at 6:30pm.

College Board Delays Release of Fall PSAT Scores

The College Board recently notified us of a change to the delivery schedule for PSAT/NMSQT® scores from the October PSAT test. Instead of a December release of scores, students who took the test will be able to access their PSAT score report on January 7, 2016 on studentscores.collegeboard.org. Schools are scheduled to receive the paper score reports on January 20.

Once scores are released, the College Board will provide students with direct links to supports such as free, personalized practice on Khan Academy® to help them prepare for the upcoming SAT test on March 2, 2016. Instructions will be provided to students on how to link their PSAT scores directly into KHAN Academy.

HO-HO-HOBY

Sophomore students Lauren Abate and Dakota Sears have been selected as the 2016 Hugh O'Brian Youth Leadership Representatives for Timberlane. Award winners were nominated by a faculty member, completed an application, and participated in an interview with the selection committee comprised of school counselors and an assistant principal. The 2016 NH Leadership Seminar will include hands-on leadership activities, networking with top performing leaders in the state, and an exploration of leadership skills all while learning how to lead others and make a positive impact in the community. IANUARY MID-TERMS

In an effort to ready our students and staff, we have announced our mid-term exam schedule. Beginning January 19, 2016, students will be released from school at 10:55am each day of their exams. The buses will leave the high school at approximately 11:10am. Students who wish to receive extra help, make-up an exam due to an absence, or meet with a teacher either need to acquire their own transportation or take the appropriate middle school bus home at 2:15pm. Those students wishing to take the middle school bus must obtain a pass from the high school Front Office. Lunch will be available for students to purchase each day.

In the event of a snow day during exam week, exams will be pushed back a day. For example, if there is a snow day on Wednesday, those exams will take place on Thursday or the first day back to school, and all exams following will also be pushed back a day. Students who attend CTE will have their own exam schedules once we receive schedules from Salem High School and Pinkerton Academy.






Architecture Category Winner MK Livingston

What is your favorite book? Anna Karenina


What is your favorite hobby? Reading, playing the cello.


What is something about yourself that no one would know? That I love high and low culture movies and theater.
