Sophomore and Junior students that took the PSAT in October are encouraged to create a College Board account if they do not already have one. PSAT results will be available sooner for those students who have created accounts. For students without accounts, score reports will be mailed by the College Board. We encourage students to make College Board accounts as they will then be able to link the results of their PSAT to Kahn Academy for targeted SAT preparation. More information about testing and test prep will be forthcoming.

Throughout the month of November, counselors will continue meeting with Seniors to assist them with their college applications and post-secondary plans. "The Things They Carried"

The History Book Club and the English Honor Society invited the Timberlane community to a one of a kind event on Thursday, November 3rd. As part of our partnership with the Southern New Hampshire Library Cooperative, our students performed interpretative works based on their reading of The Things They Carried by Tim O'Brien.

The event was emceed by English Honor Society President and History Book Club member, James King, and student performances and original works included "Half" a monologue by Rebecca Flieder and performed by Allie O'Connor, artwork by Shan Shan Zheng, guitarist Billy Lavoie performed two songs: Fortunate Son by Creedence Clearwater Revival and Working Class Hero by John Lennon, and Allie O'Connor performed a slam piece entitled "The Ten Steps of Forgetting (And Being Forgotten)". Our event concluded with poetry by Vietnam veteran, Davis Freschi. His poetry was powerful, moving and resonated with the novel's theme of realism and horror of war.

Dead Mathematicians Society

On Monday, October 31, the AP Calculus class studies the history of Calculus through the eyes of the mathematicians who made significant contributions to the field. Each student dressed up as a mathematician, reported on their life, and presented an artifact made in their honor. They learned about the battle between who really was the founder of Calculus



(Newton or Leibniz), how Riemann was not the only mathematician to study the area under curves, and how Rolle found a distrust in Calculus although he created the first version of a theorem that we still use today.

Math Team Adds Another Win

The Timberlane Mathematics Team started out strong this year! The team earned second place in a three-way tie in Division I of the Tri-State Mathematics League at the October fifth meet at Masconomet High School, with Benjamin Longchamp as the highest scoring senior. Only one question separated Timberlane from a tie for first place with Exeter High School!

Four team members then traveled to a competition at Worcester Polytechnic Institute (WPI) on Tuesday, October 18. Over fifty schools participated from Maine, Massachusetts, Rhode Island, Connecticut, and New Hampshire. Timberlane senior Emily Farone was the highest scoring team member earning a \$1000 scholarship per year should she attend WPI.

Timberlane will be hosting a meet here at the high school on Wednesday, January 25, 2017.
