NATO extends membership offer to Montenegro

December 2, 2015 was a historic day for the tiny Baltic state of Montenegro. NATO (North Atlantic Treaty Organization) official extended an invitation to Montenegro to become a member state. If Montenegro accepts this offer, it will be the 29th member of the organization.

The Prime Minister Of Montenegro, Milo Djukanovic said that the invitation to join NATO was a big step for the Balkans region. The decision to officially invite Montenegro to NATO did not just appear out of the nowhere though, it has been under review for nine years. Montenegro has already actively participated in operations with the organization in the past including in Afghanistan. Montenegro has also already enacted several reforms to meet the criteria of joining NATO and is now more determined than ever to complete the process. The Prime Minister also hopes that the announcement will bring more changes to the Baltic region.

However, this offer has met stiff opposition from President Vladimir Putin and the Russian Federation. According to Russian state-run Tass news agency Kremlin Spokesman Dmitry Peskov "Moscow has always noted at various levels that the continuing expansion of NATO and NATO's military infrastructure to the East, of course, cannot but lead to response actions from the East, namely, the Russian side in ensuring security interests and supporting the parity of interests,"

This resistance is not unexpected, especially with such heightened tensions between Russia and the Western Democracies over Russia's involvement in the Ukraine, along with the annexation of Crimea and the recent bombings of ISIS in Syria. Russia stated that if Montenegro

officially joined NATO, then all cooperation militarily and technical between the two countries would cease at once.

Soon after, French officials starting investigation of the case managed to find more suicide bombers planning another attack. A woman killed herself by suicide bombing, once French officials raided a hotel.

Although the attack devastated France, many countries gave its support such as Sydney Austrailia putting their lights to France's flag. Timberlane Regional High School also made a flag that supported France and the flag stated, "We stand with you," which contained messages of love and support for Timberlane's sister school in France.

Hopefully France is able to recover from this devastating attack and will be able to happily stand with all the countries to take down ISIS.

- 2. Pat's Peak, is a great place to go skiing with friends and family, and is a Timberlane favorite for both the ski club and ski team. From Plaistow to Henniker, New Hampshire it is only hour and 20 minutes which is one of the shorter drives. With 28 trails and 11 lifts, you will never get bored. Tickets range from \$38 to \$66 (half days to full days). Pat's Peak also has activities like tubing and shoe snowing.
- 3. Ragged Mountain is a family favorite with its different trails difficulties, so no matter what age you can go skiing. With Ragged Mountain an hour and half away in Danbury, New Hampshire, it is a short drive and is worth the drive. Ragged has 249 trails and 11 lifts, so no matter what, there is a different way down the mountain every time you go up. Lift tickets prices range from being free to \$79. Ragged offers some alternative activities including snowshoeing and tubing.
- 4. Cannon Mountain, one of the hardest mountains in the area to ski, is great for the more advanced skiers. The drive to Franconia, New Hampshire is 2 hours, which is a long drive compared to going to other mountains, but it is totally worth the drive in the end. Cannon has 95 trails and glades, and 10 lifts. Lift ticket prices range from being free to \$75. Another activity you can do on the mountain is snowshoeing.
- 5. Waterville Valley Resort is also a 2 hour drive to Waterville Valley, New Hampshire. Though being a bit of a drive, the travel time is worth it with the 50 trails and 10 lifts at the mountain. Lift tickets range from being free to \$77. Another things you can do at the mountain is go snowshoeing. Include cost

Shredding Into The New Season



The History of Kwanzaa

Created in 1966 by Dr Maulana Karenga, a black-studies professor at California State University of Long Beach, Kwanzaa was formed on the basis of bringing African-Americans together after the Watts riots in Los Angeles. Kwanzaa is a combination of harvest celebrations from many African-American tribes including the Ashanti and Zulu tribes. The name comes from the Swahili phrase "matunda ya kwanza" which means "first fruits."

One of the most important parts of Kwanzaa is the lighting of the Kinara. There are seven candles, one for each night of Kwanzaa. The first candle lit each year is the black

one in the center. This candle represents unity, the most important principle of Kwanzaa. Each night, after lighting the candle, one of the seven principles are discussed. Each of these principles come from African culture and relate to growing stronger in community with one another.

The seven principles of Kwanzaa are unity, self-determination, collective work and responsibility, cooperative economics, purpose, creativity, and faith. Each of these



principles has a symbol associated with it. The seven symbols are the crops, placemats, ears of corn, the seven candles, the candleholder, the unity cup, and the gifts.

Kwanzaa begins on December 26th and ends on January 1st each year. On the 31st of December, Karamu, a large African feast, is held. Celebrations of Kwanzaa vary among families but often include song, dance, and storytelling. Many families use African drums and other instruments as a base for song and dance. Stories often include folklore of the creation of Kwanzaa.

About two million people celebrate Kwanzaa each year in the United States and about thirty million worldwide. Although Kwanzaa is fairly new, it has already developed great meaning for many.

- 12 egg yolks
- 1 ½ c. granulated sugar
- 3 ½ c. light cream
- Whipped cream

Directions

1. Combine together milk, cloves, 3/4 teaspoon vanilla, and cinnamon stick into a saucepan. Slowly stir ingredients on a low heat until it reaches a low boil.

Eggnog Recipe

- 2. Whisk together egg yolks and sugar into a large bowl until fluffy.
- 3. Slowly whisk together the hot milk and eggs.
- 4. Pour mixture back into the saucepan, stir mixture nonstop for 3 mins over medium heat, do not let the mixture boil.
- 5. Strain the mixture to remove the cinnamon stick and clove.
- 6. Combine the vanilla, cream and nutmeg to the mixture and refrigerate overnight.
- 7. To serve, top with whipped cream and sprinkle some cinnamon over top.

- Ingredients • 8 oz. Cream cheese (soften)
- 1 package of Oreos
- 16 oz. white chocolate (melted)
- 48 Mini Oreos (bite size)
- Decorative icing

Directions

1. Finely crush oreos and combine with softened cream cheese in a large mixing bowl.

Melted Snowman

- 2. Line a baking sheet with parchment paper.
- 3. Create about 48(1 inch) balls and place on baking sheet pan and store in the refrigerator for an hour or until firm.
- 4. Dip each oreo ball until fully covered in melted white chocolate, allowing the white chocolate to pool at the bottom, giving the snowman a melted effect. Before the white chocolate hardens, place the mini oreo on the top as a hat. Place back on the tray and refrigerate for an hour until hard.
- 5. Use the decorative icing to create the face of the snowman.

Thomas says that while LED lights are a bit more expensive than incandescents, they use about one-tenth of the energy. This means that if you decide to use a lot of lights, LED may be the way to go in order to save money on your electric bill.

The most important part of any Christmas lights display are the basic strands of lights. These can be used to create an outline of lights around your house, as well as any bushes or small trees you may have in your yard. Candy cane lights can be used to create walkways to doorsteps or to line the front of your house. Snowflakes are great for hanging in windows or on other surfaces of your house.

Other yard decorations, including reindeer, trains, snowmen, and inflatables, can be placed throughout your yard. Be sure to spread out the yard decorations instead of grouping them tightly together. It is important not to go overboard on one type of decoration such as inflatables. Filling your yard with large decorations will make the display look unorganized and throw together. Using your whole yard for decorating will allow for a better light presentation.

Here are a few tips on how to make your college tour successful and beneficial for yourself.



How To Prep for The New SAT

The new SAT has some of the biggest changes in over 30 years, and it's making its debut in March of 2016.

The new standardized test will be used for people who plan on attending college and will impact the class of 2017 and younger. There are a lot of new changes, including additions and take-aways from the current SAT. The research team that creates SAT tests are working to their full potential and closely monitoring the changes, making sure that all test-takers are aware of what the new SAT has in store.

The new SAT consists of changes in many different areas of the test. According to College Board, there are 8 new fundamental changes in the New SAT. Instead of having three sections of Math, Critical Reading and Writing Skills, the new test only has two sections which are Evidence-based Reading/Writing and Math. The length of the test depends on if the test taker decides to write the essay portion, which is optional in the new SAT but required in the current one. If test-takers do decide

to write the essay, the new test is only five minutes longer than it is today.

Another major change is that there are only 4 multiple choice answers instead of 5 and if a test-taker gets an answer incorrect, there are no points deducted. In the new SAT, there will be a total of 152 questions compared to 170, allowing students to have more time for each question.

Although there are a lot of changes to the new SAT compared to the current one, preparing for it isn't much different. Test-takers should continue to focus on studying critical reading, writing and everyday high school math in order to be well prepared. Also, timing is key, so practice exams and the PSATs are still highly recommended. Understanding new concepts and becoming strong in certain areas takes practice, therefore test-takers should not wait until the night before to study for the SAT.

The use of steroids is basically cheating to be the best in their field. Elite athletes train every day in order to better and work out the flaws in their game. However, a steroid user can easily cover up these flaws by having the advantage of strength and endurance to power their way through an event.

Take baseball for example. Barry Bonds broke the home run record in the MLB previously held by Hank Aaron. Barry
Bonds was able to hit more homeruns in a shorter time frame than Hank Aaron due his steroid use. Hank Aaron had to use pure mechanics in order to hit the amount of homers
he did whereas Barry Bonds could rely on his strength to put them over the fence.

Steroids need to be taken out sports as an entity. Although the excitement for many of the games will be increased, and players will be competing at a higher level of performance and breaking records, the risk involved for not only the user but the opponents as well can be extremely dangerous.
