During this past summer staff members have been busy learning new ways to reach and teach all of our students, regardless of ability. Our school's SINI (School In Need of Improvement) Plan has been revised and will be posted on our web site shortly. Many Pollard teachers participated in trainings to learn more about the Common Core State Standards and the NWEA (Northwest Evaluation Association) MAP (Measures of Academic Progress) testing. These are the test that your child has been taking during the past few weeks if they are in grades 2-5.

As I am sure you have heard, EEE has started to creep back into the news. I understand that this is a concern for many parents so I have spoken with Denise Horrack from the Town of Plaistow to make sure we are doing all that we should here at Pollard. She assures me that Plaistow is testing and no mosquitoes have been found carrying the virus as of yet in our area. She also asked that I encourage parents to make sure that their children wear long sleeves and pants when they are outside, especially after dusk. We only have a short window to be cautious. Once we have a hard frost we should be all set.

I would like to remind you that we would like all sick children and adults to stay home when they are sick. We know and understand that most parents are working outside of the home but we think that we all need to try to keep the germs out of school as best as possible. Please remember to let us know why your child is being called out sick when you call the absent line. (382-7146 x-1) If the nurse calls to have you come pick up your child because they are sick please try your best to get here as soon as possible. Thank you for your help in this matter.

In an effort to assure that all students are "teacher ready" by 8:40, staff will be welcoming students in to the building 10 minutes earlier than last year. Students can go through the car drop-off line at 8:20 and it is our goal to have everyone in by 8:35 so instruction can begin promptly at 8:40 AM and you children will go home on their regularly assigned buses at 3:10 PM each afternoon.

An essential element of a successful school is providing students and staff with a healthy and safe environment, where teachers have a right to teach, and students have a right to learn. At Pollard School we acknowledge that each individual student is at a different developmental level. Therefore, our objective is to foster self-discipline and develop responsible members of society. It is expected that students will treat each other with dignity and respect. As students develop and make choices we provide educational opportunities that support and provide them with a reflective learning opportunity. When a reflective learning situation occurs students might be asked to complete a "Bucket Dipping Think Sheet", and/or a student behavior form. To continue to have continuous communication between home/school parents are asked to sign these forms and return them to school.

Children receive the best education when parents and teachers work together as a team. As a parent and an educator I am aware how true this is. I look forward to celebrating with you many student successes and accomplishments this school year. NECAP Testing

During the first three weeks of October, students in grades 3-5 will be participate in the New England Common Assessment Program (NECAP). All students will be tested in reading and mathematics, but only 5th graders will be tested in writing. The New England Common Assessment program will be one of the important tools available to parents and educators to determine how well our students are applying their grade level skills. In every assessment, scores are only as meaningful as the effort students put into the assessment. Encourage your child to give her or her best effort. You can best help your child prepare for the assessment by making sure that she or he is rested on the days the tests are given. And, as with every day, it is critical that students have a good breakfast before heading off to school, and that they arrive on time. Thank you for supporting your child and our school during this testing period.

5th Grade will test October 1st ~ 4th 4th Grade will test October 9th, 10th, & 11th 3rd Grade will test October 15th, 16th, & 17th All make-ups will follow scheduled testing dates.

Please remember to call the absent line by **9am**, 603-382-7146, #1, if your child will be absent or if your child is going to be late to school.

Students who do not arrive on the bus may not be dropped off at Pollard until 8:20am. Students need to be at school by 8:35am in order to insure that they are not tardy. Students who are not in their classrooms by 8:40am will be marked tardy.

When your child has a <u>change in their dismissal plan</u>, we need to have it <u>from you in</u> <u>writing</u>. If that change involves your child taking a bus, <u>we need to have the bus</u> <u>number and the address to which your child is going</u>.

Welcome Back Pollard Families and Friends!

Hello and welcome to the first 2012-2013 Counselor Corner. This section of the Pollard Pen will focus on ways that children, their caretakers, and the school can work together to promote social and academic success in the lives of Pollard students. I have visited all kindergarten and most 1st grade classes to introduce myself to your children. I read a book called, "The Invisible String" which talks about how everyone has invisible strings that connect them to people they love, even when they're apart. Ask your child who their invisible string is connected to and you'll hear what they shared with me and their classmates.



Tip: Connecting with Your Child

Bedtime Debriefing: To really connect with your kids, spend a few minutes before bedtime going over the day. Ask specific questions: "What was the most interesting thing that happened at school today?", "What was the nicest thing you did for someone today?", "What are you looking forward to tomorrow?", "What challenged you most about today?" Then listen. It's an easy, effective way to keep up with how they are doing.


Our enrichment committee will be planning many exciting school wide enrichment activities this year - topics and dates to come.

Technology - A New Year and a New Program!

All the students from first to fifth grade will be using a new program during technology this year as a way to implement the technology curriculum. The program, EasyTech, will help the students with technology skills and applying those skills. It also has lessons concerning online safety and cyber-bullying that will help the students learn appropriate ways to use online resources. The program uses lessons, activities, journals, discussions, quizzes and games to teach and reinforce the district and national technology standards and will provide continuity throughout the district. So far the student response has been very positive.

Just a reminder - in order for the student to use this new program they need to have access to the internet.

At the beginning of the year a form gave you the choice to restrict internet use or not.



If you chose to limit your child's use of the internet they will not be able to use this program (or other educational online resources). I will be glad to answer any questions about our procedures for dealing with the students and the internet so you can feel comfortable allowing them to use all of our supportive online programs. If you would like to change your decision please send a note with your child to the office. If you did not send the form back your child is automatically restricted from the internet until the form is received in the office.

Occasional notes from the library

Pollard School Library has been a busy place these first few weeks of school with students visiting for circulation and classes coming for information literacy lessons. Kindergartners have already made their first library visit and have met Mother Goose. First graders are quickly becoming independent library users as they practice library routines. Second graders are learning to think like "Goldisocks" in the library to help them make "just right" independent reading choices. Third grade children have been talking about "good fit" books and reading some excerpts from transitional chapter books. Fourth grade students went on a scavenger hunt to demonstrate how quickly they could locate print and electronic resources in the library. Finally, fifth grade students have been asking, "Can It Be For Me?", learning some using quick strategies to inform book choice.

Pollard School is already well under way on what I hope will be a literate enriching school year. Ms. Gallagher's first grade class read the book **The Gingerbread Man Loose in the School** and then followed the gingerbread through the building to get reaquainted with VIP's in school. We added a technology twist to this popular activity. Each poster of the gingerbread man hanging in various locations had a QR code on it. The children used our IPOD Touches to scan the codes and bring up a picture of the VIP!

On September 14th we took part in the celebration of International Dot Day. Inspired by Peter Reynold's book **The Dot**, the event invites children worldwide to, "Make your mark and see where it takes you." Every class visited the library and watched the story on DVD and then every child "made their mark". Ours dots will be "dot"ting the hallways soon!!

September 19th is "Talk Like a Pirate" day and Mrs. Laudani's class came to the library to do just that. We read the story **A Pirate's Guilde to First Grade** together and used the glossary to practice pirate vocabulary. The children went back to class sporting temporary tatoo's of a pirate reading a book!

We have begun Poetry Fridays and will be celebrating poets and poems all year long. Time is set aside each Friday for one class to come to the library to read and recite poetry. Mrs. Coyle-Quirk's fifth grade class read some somber poems from a collection titled **This Place I Know**. The poems were written to express feelings after 9/11/2001. Rachel Vaughn ran in place while her classmates in Mrs. Winter's fourth grade class recited "Fifty Yard Dash" and Mrs. Rodriguez's third grade students pantomined some favorite playground activities while reciting the poem "Recess". Mrs. Toscano and Mrs. McFarlin's classes are waiting for their turns - coming right up.
