As we prepare our students for the 21st Century and ask them, "What do you want to be when you grow up?" This question takes on a new meaning when we think about what the job market will be like in the future. In just 15 years, it is predicted that over two billion jobs will disappear, as robots and automation will make jobs such a commercial piloting, legal work, technical writing, telemarketing, accounting, retail work, and real estate sales obsolete. It is amazing to think that the majority of today's kindergartners will have jobs that don't currently exist today. As we prepare our students for their future, developing their critical thinking skills has become a 21st century focus. I wanted to share with you the definition of critical thinking and the components I have researched from the enVision website.

A DEFINITION OF CRITICAL THINKING

Researchers from Pearson's Research & Innovation Network recently engaged in a comprehensive literature review to define the construct of critical thinking. The review encompassed more than 50 articles, including theoretical pieces, empirical studies an emta-analyses written by authors across the globe. Based on the results of the review, we present a general definition of critical thinking and its specific cognitive, metacognitive, and dispositions sub-components.



GENERAL DEFINITION

Critical thinking involves purposeful and goal-directed thinking used to define and solve problems, make decisions or form judgments related to a particular situation or set of circumstances. It involves cognitive, metacognitive and dispositional components which may manifest (or be applied) differently in specific contexts

COGNITIVE SUB-COMPONENTS

- · Identifying central issues & assumptions
- Recognizing important relationships
- Forming hypotheses

- Making inferences (deductive/inductive)
- Seeking evidence & criteria
- Differentiating opinion from evidence
- · Considering alternative opinions/theories
- · Avoiding biased reasoning
- Weighting evidence
- Asking clarifying questions
- Making counter arguments

- · Using criteria to make judgments
- · Explaining evidential, conceptual, methodological considerations for a judgment

METACOGNITIVE SUB-COMPONENTS

- Knowledge of oneself as a learner and what factors might influence one's performance (self-appraisal)
- · Awareness and management of cognition, including knowledge about strategies
- · Knowledge about why and when to use a given strategy

- · Planning (ID and selection of appropriate strategies and allocation of resources)
- · Self-regulation (attending to and being aware of comprehension and task performance)
- Evaluation & appraisal; revisiting and revising goals

DISPOSITIONAL SUB-COMPONENTS

- Open-mindedness & flexibility
- Tolerance of ambiguity
- Willingness to suspend judgment
- · Sensitivity to others (social aspect)

Curriculum Corner Online Learning/Blizzard Bag Day Frequently Asked Questions for Elementary Parents

1. What is an Online Learning/Blizzard Bag Day?

Online Learning/Blizzard Bag Day is a "snow" day during which students will work at home on online instruction and assignments provided by their teachers.

2. Will every snow day be an Online Learning/Blizzard Bag Day?

No. There will be some traditional snow days. The NH Department of Education has approved Timberlane's Online Learning/Blizzard Bag Day plan for a maximum of five days. An Online Learning/Blizzard Bag Day will not be scheduled when a large-scale power outage may occur.

3. How will I know if it is an Online Learning/Blizzard Bag Day or just a No School Day?

The decision will be made by the SAU if an inclement weather day is a No School Day or an Online Learning/Blizzard Bag Day. Parents will be notified through Power Announcement (the district's emergency notification system). On-line lessons will be used.

4. How will my child receive instruction or lessons?

- **K-2**: Instruction and lessons for reading and math will be provided through a preapproved take home copy. Blizzard Bag lessons will be sent home in advance of Blizzard Bag days. On October 23, 2015, a folder containing the 1st and 2nd Blizzard Bag lessons will be sent home in advance of a Blizzard Bag day. The lessons will only be used when a Blizzard Bag day has been decided by the district. Teachers will be available via e-mail from 10:00am-2:00pm to answer any questions.
- **3-5**: Instruction and lessons for reading and math will be provided through your child's google apps for education account. Teachers in grades 3-5 will be using Google Classroom.

Students in grades 3-5 will have lessons assigned to them which they will complete online and submit to their teachers. Teachers will be available online during the 10:00am-2:00pm window. Teachers will respond with feedback, questions, or comments, and students can continue working. When students complete the lesson they submit the lesson to be graded by their teacher. Students may work online at other times during the day, but teachers are only available from 10:00—2:00 for immediate feedback.

During the lessons, students can log on and off as needed. It is not expected nor required for them to stay at the computer during the window of time. Documents on Google Classroom save automatically, so students do not need to worry if their work will be lost.

5. What if my child has Art, P.E., or Music on the Online Learning/Blizzard Bag Day?

Students will only do <u>one special per day</u>. Look at the matrix and follow what special your child will be doing. Specials will be completed during the Online Learning/Blizzard Bag Day. Lessons in grades K-2 will be turned into the classroom teacher when they return to school. Lessons in grades 3-5 will be completed on Google Classroom. Every student, regardless of grade will receive a hard copy of the special lesson. Lessons can also be accessed through our school's web page.

Reminders from the Front Office:

- If your child will be <u>absent</u> or <u>late to school</u>, please remember to call the attendance line by <u>9am</u> at 603-382-7146, #1 with the reason for the absence or tardy.
- Students who are absent due to illness or are late or dismissed due to a doctor's appointment will have their absence, tardy or dismissal excused only with a note from the doctor verifying the absence or appointment.
- Students who arrive by car may not be dropped off at Pollard's car drop off area until 8:15am. Students need to be at school by 8:25am in order to ensure that they are not tardy. **Students who are not in their classrooms by 8:30am will be marked tardy.** If you child is tardy, please sign them in at the front office.
- When your child has a <u>change in their dismissal plan</u>, we need to have it <u>from you in writing</u>. If that change involves your child taking a bus, <u>we need to have the bus number and the address</u> to which your child is going.
- It is very important to keep your contact information up to date in case of an emergency. Please remember to let the office know of any changes in your **contact information** and that of your **emergency contacts.**
