Dear Pollard Families:

Happy New Year! Wow, its 2017 and almost half way through our school year already! In just another few weeks we will be celebrating our 100th day here at Pollard.

Winter has finally shown its ugly side! With each winter comes the possibility of inclement weather that may impact our school day. If school is cancelled, you will receive a School Messenger message on your home phone as listed on your child's emergency information. The SAU tries to get that message out around 5:30 am, if the decision is made by that time. In the event of an unexpected early dismissal, there will also be a School Messenger Announcement call to the numbers that you have given the school; home, both parent's cell and both parents' work. It is very important that you keep the school updated with any changes to phone numbers. In the event of an unscheduled early release, please call the school if there will be a change in your student's transportation or if you have questions. Weather may also cause delays with our buses. Please be aware that buses may be delayed at least 30 minutes on snowy days and if this is the case I will try to get a School Messenger announcement out to students' parents for those particular buses. Also, make sure that you have a plan in place for your child in the event that you are delayed in getting home due to poor weather. Please call the school if you have questions.

It is extremely important that you listen to the entire School C Messenger announcement for "School Cancellation" days. Winter Playground



For your information:

Temperatures including wind chill are considered before sending students out to the playground for recess. When the temperature falls below 20F, taking in account of the wind chill, the students are kept indoors.

As a reminder: Please send your child to school with a coat, hats, gloves, snow pants and boots. These items are needed for the children to play in the snow during outdoor recess.

Head lice (Pediculosis Capitis)

With the return to school after winter break and family vacations, this is a reminder that, like many childhood issues, Head lice (Pediculosis Capitis) can be a common occurrence with children. Head lice is not solely a school problem but often is addressed within the school community. These parasites cannot, fly, jump or crawl long distances, and they do not cause illness. They are transmitted from one child to another through direct head to head contact or, much less commonly, by sharing combs, brushes, hats, or bedding, Head lice are not associated with poor hygiene. Lice can happen to anyone.

Parents and family members are often the first to recognize the most common symptom of head lice which is constant itching of the head, particularly behind the ears or at the nape of the neck.

This is a reminder that it is important to check your child's hair regularly. Observe for itching of the scalp. If itching is noted...

• Carefully examine the hair and scalp of your children and all family members for lice and/or their eggs. Lice are small, the size of a sesame seed and tan or grey and move quickly. Nits (eggs) are small, oval shaped and gray or white in color. Nits are usually firmly attached (glued) to the hair shaft, close to the scalp. It may help to use a magnifying glass to detect them.

• Remind your children that the best prevention is to avoid head to head contact with others, keep hair pulled up or braided, and not to use or borrow anyone's personal accessories like brushes, hats or combs.

If you suspect your child has lice, check with your health care provider, school nurse or pharmacist for instructions on how to treat an infestation. The school nurse will give ongoing support and ensure student confidentiality. If you have treated your child for head lice, please consider informing the parents of your child's close playmates. As we move into the spring months our students will be taking many standardized tests. These include SBAC for our students in grades 3-5 and NECAP Science for grades 4. Below are some thoughts about what standardized testing is and why we do them with our students.

What are standardized tests?

Usually created by commercial test publishers, standardized tests are designed to give a common measure of students' performance. Because large numbers of students throughout the country take the same test, they give educators a common yardstick or "standard" of measure. Pollard uses these standardized tests to tell us how well the school programs are succeeding and to give us a picture of the skills and abilities of our students.

Why do we use standardized tests?

Standardized tests can help teachers and administrators make decisions regarding the instructional program. They help us measure how our students are doing in a given class, and in relation to other students who take the same test. Using the results from these tests we can evaluate our Pollard School programs and better meet student needs.

Can standardized tests alone determine my child's placement in the classroom?

No. standardized tests give us only part of the picture of your child's strengths and weaknesses. We combine the results of these tests with other methods to gain insights into the skills, abilities, and knowledge of your child. These methods include:

- Observing students in the classroom
- Evaluating day-to-day classwork
- Grading homework assignments
- Meeting with parents
- Keeping close track of how students change or grow throughout the year

Standardized tests have limitations. These tests are not perfect measures of what individual students can or cannot do or of everything students learn. Also, your child's scores on a particular test may vary from day to day, depending on whether your child guesses, receives clear directions, follows the directions carefully, takes the test seriously, and is comfortable in taking the test.

As we move into state testing please feel free to contact me with any questions or concerns. Working together we know our students will be able to show all they've learned!

Reminders from the Front Office:

- If your child will be <u>absent</u> or <u>late to school</u>, please <u>call the attendance line</u> by <u>9am</u> at <u>603-382-7146, #4</u>, with the reason for the absence or tardy. Students are marked absent until they arrive at school. Parents must come into the school and sign their child in if they are arriving late. Students who are not in their classroom by 8:30am are considered tardy
- Students who arrive by car may not be dropped off at Pollard's car drop off area until 8:15am. Students need to be at school by 8:25am in order to ensure that they are not tardy. Students who are not in their classrooms by 8:30am will be marked tardy. If you child is tardy, you must sign them in at the front office.
- Students who are absent due to illness or are late or dismissed due to a doctor's appointment will have their absence, tardy or dismissal excused <u>only</u> with a note, sent into school within 5 days, from the doctor verifying the absence or appointment.
- When your child has a <u>change in their dismissal plan</u>, we need to have it <u>from</u> you in writing. If that change involves your child <u>taking a bus</u>, <u>we need to</u> <u>have the bus number and the address to which your child is going.</u>
- It is very important to keep your contact information up to date in case of an emergency. Please remember to let the office know of any changes in your <u>contact information</u> and that of your <u>emergency contacts</u>.
