

Dear Pollard Families:

Happy Spring! This year has been such a mild winter but we have had our difficulties due to the cold. We are still waiting on a few parts that will close out the repairs that we had to complete due to the frozen pipe that burst in our main entrance area. The main office is all dried out but the Fire Panel had to be completely replaced, much rewiring and part replacement needed to be done throughout the entire building to get us back to 100%. I want to thank all our parents, staff and especially our students for making the emergency dismissal run so smoothly. The First Baptist Church and Reverend Aaron Goodro were extremely helpful and we could not have done it without them. Plaistow Fire & Police as well as our custodians worked hard to get us back in session and we appreciate all of their hard work and true dedication to the students and staff of Pollard. Our school Safety team has met and we are reflecting on all of our procedures and making changes where we felt we needed to. I do want to pass along that NH Commissioner of Education, Virginia Barry Ph.D., has approved our waiver for the day we missed, Monday, February 15, 2016. Our Online Learning/Blizzard Bag Day on February 16th was also a HUGE success. 96.2% of our students and staff completed their work so this will count as a day of school. Barring any spring snow surprises, it appears that our last day of school will be a half day on Monday, June 13th.

Incoming Kindergarten registration has already begun and I want to remind everyone with children that will be entering Kindergarten in the fall that they should call our main office to begin the registration process. For those that have already begun the registration process, we will be sending out invitations to our Kindergarten Screening soon. We plan on having all incoming kindergarteners the week of May 2nd. 
All grade levels are busy working on Arbor Day posters in art class. The theme for the Arbor Day contest this year is "Save the Trees, Save the Planet". Every year, all students at Pollard participate in the poster contest, and 5th graders also create Arbor Day poems for the contest. The contest is sponsored by the Plaistow Conservation Committee. Good luck artists and poets! Our 5th graders are just beginning their historical figure puppets. It is exciting to watch the puppets evolve. 4th graders are beginning to paint their 3-d monochromatic anoles. See if they can explain monochromatic. The 3rd graders are finishing up a unit about line. They have done continuous contour line drawings, blind contour line drawings, and they are finishing up with fabulous contour line drawings of objects in the room using careful observation. Our 2nd graders have learned about Vincent Van Gogh. They did a project called "If Van Gogh visited Boston" combining oil pastel and collage. They are also using oil pastels to create their favorite Van Gogh! Counselor Corner



Greetings Pollard Families:

Motivating students to learn all that they can in school is too important a job to assign to just one group. Teachers need to teach kids how to learn; parents need to teach kids how to work. Everyone must work together in order for students to be successful. For children, having their parents involved in what is going on at school is a critical ingredient to their success. Parents and teachers must work as partners to enhance every child's motivation and performance. The following expectations for parents and teachers have been reached through numerous studies over the years. I hope you find some of them useful.

- Success is the greatest motivator. Recognize, reinforce, and celebrate the child's successes and progress even the small victories.
- Compliment children for good decisions.
- Reinforce the child for small gains in a difficult subject area. Reward direction, not perfection.
- Speak positively and supportively about the child's school and teachers. If the child senses a parent's hostility toward the school, it is unlikely that the child will be motivated to succeed there.
- Do not tell a child that a task "will be easy" in order to enhance her motivation. ("Come on, Beverly, let's get started on that map homework. It should be a cinch!") This well-intentioned strategy often backfires. If the child does well on the task, she is not particularly delighted because the assignment was labeled "easy." Conversely, if she has difficulty with the assignment, she has failed at a "simple task." Either way, the child's pride and self-esteem are not enhanced. A more effective approach is to say, "This task is a challenge, but I know you can do it."
- Celebrate risk-taking behavior on the part of children. The willingness to take risks is fundamental to school success and motivation.

Work with your child in an effort to improve his organizational, time management, and scheduling skills. In summary, families that foster student motivation are: warm, loving, consistent, supportive, encouraging, accepting, cooperative, concerned and respectful.

Well it's that time of year again. All kinds of musical happenings going on for our elementary students. First of all we have our 5th grade All District Band rehearsal on Monday night March 28th. While this is going on there will be a meeting for parents with Mr. Schweiss, who is the middle school band director. This is an informational meeting about 6th grade band. However due to the testing going on the following day in some of our elementary schools, we are leaving it up to parents to decide whether you stay for the entire concert or leave after the 5th grade is done. The entire concert should be over by 8:15ish. Maybe you could stay and at least hear the 6th grade band.

On April 13th we will be having our 4th grade All District Band concert. The report time for students this night is also 6:15. The concert will also take place in the main concert hall at the PAC. Once again because there are other groups performing we ask that the students stay for the entire concert. This concert will also include some of our elementary orchestra players. Your orchestra teacher will be sending home more information regarding this group.

Also just as a heads up, start looking for information regarding the instrument start up dates for elementary students. More information will soon be coming home. The sessions will occur during the first week of June.


