
The winter season is drawing to a close and what a difference this year was from last year! Our students have had many opportunities to enjoy the fresh outdoor air during recess this year which they have so enjoyed. I want to take this opportunity to thank both our students and staff for taking a challenging situation and working together to make this the best possible year for all of us. The district continues to seek our input regarding our needs and together we are working to address concerns. Our older students have been most respectful, serving as role models and leaders with the younger students. Our Student Council has been working with Mr. Ciarla to bring fresh student-centered ideas to our school.

I must say that our students are not shy. It is not unusual for one of them to approach Mrs. Stafford or me to offer an opinion or an idea that has been on his/her mind. I thank the staff of Sandown North, each and every one of them, for creating an environment where young students feel protected, where older students know they have a respected voice, and where all students feel supported.

As you know, we take the safety of all very seriously. Our Emergency Response Team recently took the first part of a Federal Safety course together to be certain that we were using the correct vocabulary, the vocabulary that our responders would be using in the event of an emergency. Additionally, all best practices and the rationale were reviewed to be certain that we, in a school setting, understand why things are done the way that they are. The team will now be exploring part 2 of the learning, with a presenter from Homeland Security

joining us for the learning experience. We have clearly specified plans at school and strongly suggest that you have plans at home, especially back-up plans in the event that you are not at the bus stop for your child. Traffic and emergency situations may make you late one day. Please remember that students in grades 2-5 can be dropped off without a parent or adult being present. Your children should know what to do. Do they know where the key is and how to get into your home? Do they have a cell phone number or other way to reach you? Do they have a trusted neighbor whom they can contact? Is the school number posted so they can call us if they feel worried and can't reach you? Everybody's plans will probably be a little bit different but it is important that it is communicated clearly to your child. Hopefully, all will always go according to plan but in the event that it doesn't, we want to be sure that our students know just what to do.

All of our students should know that in the event of a true emergency in their home, when their safety or that of a family member is at risk, they should call 911. Thanks in advance for your cooperation.



# Please remember to notify the <u>front office</u> when your child is going to be absent or tardy prior to the start of the school day.

At the beginning of each school day we account for each student's absence. Our priority is the safety of all students. If we do not hear from you, to assure that your child is safe, we will contact you to verify the absence. To do this in a timely manner, it is most important that you notify us before the school day begins.

Please call the attendance line. Notifying a teacher or the school nurse does not mean the information will be passed to the front office. We ask that you do not send e-mails as well.

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## From the Assistant Principal

Beginning this month our students in grades 3, 4 and 5 will be taking the NH standardized Smarter Balanced Assessment. It is important that your child is present and arrives to school on time. Testing will take place first thing in the morning beginning at 9:00am. Students arriving late will not be allowed to join their classroom until after the session has been completed for the day and will make-up the test at a different time. Your cooperation and support is much appreciated.

#### Test dates are as follows:

Grade 4 March 15th - March 25th Grade 3 March 28th - April 8th Grade 5 April 11th - April 22nd

Make up days are built in to the schedule.

The following tips may help you prepare your child for the assessment:

- Explain the purpose of the test. Remind your child that this is not a test that a student can fail. It is an opportunity for students to show what they have learned in school.
- Be sure that your child gets plenty of sleep and has a nourishing breakfast and lunch.
- Send your child with a healthy snack and water bottle.
- Be sure your child is at school on time as we don't want students rushing and worrying about being late.
