Digital Citizen: The International Society for Technical Education (ISTE) promotes responsible use of technology to promote inquiry, collaboration, purpose, and creativity. Digital citizens use the tools of technology in service to community at all levels. At Sandown North we emphasize safety, positive collaboration, care, and purpose as the cornerstones of digital citizenship:

- Students are encouraged to seek teacher and parental guidance.
- They are taught not to share personal identifying information.
- They have opportunities to work together in informal and structured groups.
- They are expected to take care of shared tools.
- They receive guidance and instruction in developing productive technology habits of use.

This last point is the most challenging. For every tool for research, learning, problem solving, and creating, there seems to be an army of distracting alternatives. Understanding purpose and developing effective habits of use are essential to leveraging technology to the digital citizen's advantage.
