If you have not had the opportunity to take a tour of learning.com with your child yet, I encourage you to do so. Your child will log in using his or her username and password. They will show you the different activities they have done and the activities available to them.

After logging in students see up to three class choices: Basic skill practice is titled with their grade level, the essential activities class is titled with their teacher's name, and extension activities class is titled Grade Level Extras! Students are expected to complete at least one essential activity per class before choosing basic skill practice or extension activities.
