So many Thank You's need to be said and so many individuals still need to be acknowledged privately, but I need to tell you that, as a school community, the level of quiet support was incredible. I need to say a special thank you to Nancy Stafford, Mary Beth Sharp, and Kristin Clifford for their work on the Saturday we heard the sad news. I was out of town for most of that day, so they immediately went into action and took the first steps. Dr. Metzler, Mrs. Susan Rasicot, Mrs. Roxanne Wilson and Mrs. Louiselle were there to offer district support in any way that we determined would be helpful. I so appreciated that they understood our need to move forward with what we believed our staff and students would need and then to respond. Our Emergency/Crisis Team responded by meeting all morning on Sunday and then being here to support students, staff and families on Sunday afternoon. On Sunday and for the next couple of days, counselors from the Timberlane High School, Danville Elementary, and Pollard School worked with our students and staff. The team was led by Shayna McTeague, the School Psychologist from Atkinson

Academy, and supported by several members of our team. I tell you this to assure you that plans are in place in the event of a crisis such as this one. We thank those of you who also reached out in person or by phone in so many ways, and to let you know that we welcome your calls informing us of your concerns for your child. By working together, we can give our students what they need to process situations and to feel safe and comfortable in their school. Our thoughts continue to be with the Chester family in this most difficult time. One again, thank you for working so closely with all of us and for truly being partners in your child's education. Remember, you are always welcome to join us at Monday Morning Meetings at 8:45, to smile, as our students share their learning.

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
# Instructions for accessing Envision Math

3. Enter the student's


Timberlane username and
