They plan lessons that teach the curriculum to all, while at the same time, differentiating to meet the needs of individuals. These women, along with many others, give so much of their time and energy to make our school a place where families feel welcome and are willing to work with us to make our school an even better place to be. Whenever we reach out for assistance, our families respond. We are all so appreciative and love seeing you at Monday Morning Meeting to celebrate our learners.

Chief Gordon and Chief Topley work closely with us to help our students understand that they are there to help students and to educate them as well. We all want to remind you that our children need to know and understand your family's plans in the event of an emergency. If there should be a fire in your home, children need to know the plan for escape. Chief Topley shared that deaths are more likely to occur in the home than in the school because children panic in their homes. They may hide or crouch down in panic and not act. We practice fire drills almost monthly so they know just what to do and respond right away at the sound of the alarm. Also, please be sure that your child knows what to do if s/he comes home and you are not there. Our young children are not dropped off if an adult is not visible; our bus drivers do their best to ensure safety, always, but children should know what to do in the event that all does not go according to plan. Please take the time to review possible situations with your children so they will not panic, but instead will know what to do and will feel empowered, not afraid.

I have said this for years, but especially at this time of year and especially this year, I need to repeat that we, in the Sandown North community, are so lucky to work together to benefit our students. I appreciate that you are willing to work together to brainstorm ways we can meet the needs of our students. I wish you a Happy Thanksgiving.....and a fun Halloween, too.




