From the Desk of Jo-Ann Georgian, Principal

This New England weather has hit us with all sorts of challenges this month. March has come in with rain and snow, with warm weather and freezing cold weather. Hopefully, spring really is just around the corner; the children are looking forward to consistently warmer weather.

As we look at our phone alerts, watch TV, and read the newspapers, we see stories of school shootings, a sad and frightening thought for all of us. The safety of our students and staff members is of paramount importance to me. I am a member of the District Safety Committee and we also have a Safety Committee at school. In addition, an Emergency Response Team and a Crisis Team also have roles and responsibilities. We meet regularly and look at our practices and provide staff members with needed information.

At Sandown North, we practice drills on a scheduled basis but do not notify staff of the date and time so that we can see where there may be confusions or glitches with a drill. We ask for feedback and what individuals noticed, and then debrief after the drill. The purpose is not to criticize, but to learn from the practice and to make any needed changes or tweaks to the plans.

The most complex drill we have is the offsite evacuation because we do need to leave the building. We do not announce the date or time to staff or to family members so that the experience is authentic. We think about our students with physical or emotional needs and how to help them feel comfortable getting to the site and while we are there. As you know, we have traveled to Chester in the past as our go-to site. They have been most accommodating and have worked closely with us, but there would be fewer variables if we could stay in town. We have contacted Zorvino's Vineyards and they have so nicely agreed to let us use their building as our off-site location.

I completely understand parents' worry about school safety and want you to be assured that we take it very seriously. We work closely with Chief Gordon and Chief Tapley so that we all have a clear understanding of what is expected. I have submitted my Basic Emergency Operation Plan to the state with Dr. Metzler's approval, outlining our plans in the event of an emergency. There is comfort in being prepared and practiced. As part of the district safety plan, we have worked together at all levels, elementary, middle, and high school, so that the drills are familiar, regardless of which school child attends in our district. Student Safety is always on our minds.
