

Tips for Using Google Classroom with TRSD Google Apps for Education

Chrome should be the web browser used to get the best results. When you shut down your computer, it updates automatically. You will need to have the latest version of your web browser to use Google apps for education. *Examples of a web browser are: Microsoft Explorer; Mozilla Firefox; Safari; and Linux.*

You can download **Chrome** for free. It is owned by Google, so it works best with Google Apps for Education, although it is not necessary if you are up to date with browsers.

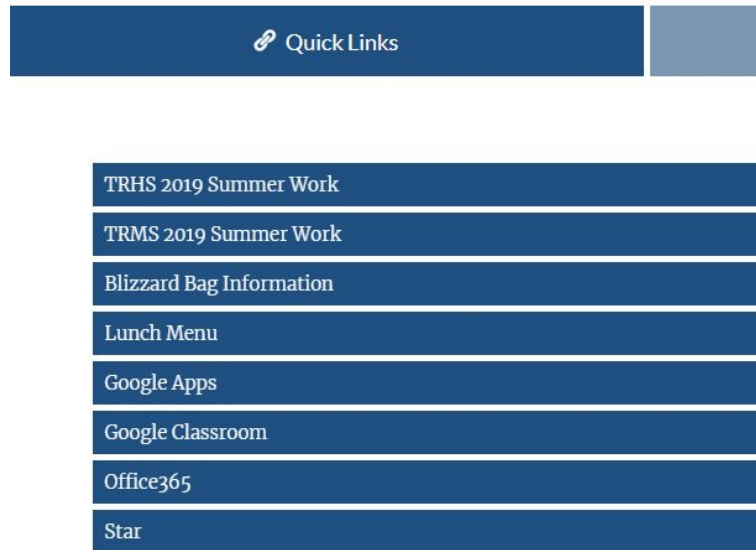

Using Google Classroom at home

If you are using a laptop or desktop computer, go to the school's webpage and click on the student tab.



A new page opens. Scroll down to google classroom. Then click on it to open it.



Students must be signed in to their school Gmail account. If someone has a personal Gmail open, you must sign out.

Google Apps for Android

If you want to access Classroom from your Android device, download the Classroom app from Google Play as well as Google Docs, Google draw, google sheets, and google forms

1. Touch **Google Play Store** on your device.
2. Find and install all the **Google apps**. They are all free.

Google Apps for iOS

If you want to use Classroom on your iPhone® or iPad®, download the Classroom app, google docs, google sheets, google draw, and google form from the App Store.

1. Touch **App Store** on your device.

2. Find and install **all the Google Apps in the** app store. They are all free.
