We are still gathering data to be able to directly answer this question, but our intent is to have a teacher who teachers students who are fully remote through a remote model. This might require grade span but the student will interact with like aged peers and be instructed by a qualified teacher. If a student is remote trimester 1 and returns to school in a cohort model for trimester 2, they will likely be joining a new teacher and class but this depends on how the data changes.

We have developed a schedule where students will engage in social/emotional learning through a daily morning meeting (about 15 mins), then three core contents (math, reading, and writing). Each of these lesson sections will allow for approximately 15 mins. of direct instruction and up to an hour of some whole class or small groups or individual instruction. Our model is spread out throughout the day but we do not expect students to sit in front of the computer all day. Students will be provided with on and offline practice as well as movement breaks and times to connect with their teacher and peers.

All students within an elementary teacher's class will be on the same schedule. A teacher will not be holding online and in person at the same time at the elementary level. We will have a

reduced number of students in buildings based on cohorts which allows for a class to spread over a larger space so their community will be together for the five days.

• Sandown Central is the only building in the district with AM & PM sessions for Preschool and Pre-Kindergarten. What considerations are being made regarding cleaning and disinfecting in between morning and afternoon sessions? How will children be divided into cohorts while maintaining smaller class sizes to follow CDC guidelines? Between the four Preschool & Pre-Kindergarten teachers, there are 12 classroom groups of students who cycle through the building. (Preschool has classes: M/W morning, T/Th morning, T/Th afternoon, W/F afternoon; and Pre-Kindergarten has classes M-Th morning and T-F afternoon.)

Our 4 year olds will also recieve a full program, 2 days in person and 2 days remote. There will also be a change to full day peer partners for the same reason previously stated. That will decrease the tuition for those peer partners.

Buses will be running with limited capacity due to social distancing on the bus. 1 student per seat and siblings can sit together. Capacity will be 13 - 20 students. We will ask parents to transport if possible so that we have space for those students who definitely need bus transportation. We will adjust routing according to who is riding or not. With the blended model we are already dividing the number of riders and with families choosing full remote this will also help with the number of students who will be on a bus.
