Assistant Principal News

Teachers across the district have been working hard to implement Guided Math in their classrooms this school year. Guided Math is a way to plan math instruction that includes: number sense routines, student-directed whole group instruction, and small groups based on need and topic. This approach allows teachers to child's development support each of mathematical proficiency. By providing students with opportunities to work with teacher guidance and/or independently, students are able to build solid math skills, concepts, and strategies.

Math requires kids to be able to manipulate quantities when they add, subtract, multiply and divide. This requires having strong number-sense skills. Number sense essentially refers to student's ability to be fluid and flexible when thinking about numbers. Students should have a good idea of what numbers mean, understand the relationship between numbers, perform mental math, and use numbers in real world situations. By incorporating number sense routines in our classrooms, teachers are encouraging students to think flexibly and promoting confidence with numbers.

Things you can ask your child:

- How did you figure it out?
- Can you explain . . .
- Show me . . .
- What are you thinking . . .
- Are you sure?

Hello Danville School!

Part of my goal of being a school counselor, is help your children be as successful as possible at school. Success in school is not just about reading and math. Part of being a successful student is to be able to manage strong emotions. I continue to use the Second Step program to help teach this skill and your children really seem to enjoy it!

My goal for your children, is to develop their ability to manage their own strong feelings before feelings escalate and result in negative consequences. To achieve this goal, student will learn how to:

- Recognize how strong feelings affect their brains and bodies
- Calm down, using Calming Down Steps
- Manage strong feelings

Teaching students to recognize strong feelings and use Calm-Down Steps to stay in control increases coping skills and reduces aggression and other problem behaviors.

Practice Second Step Skills at Home: How to Calm Down

Stop – use your signal **Name your Feeling Calm Down –** Breathe, Count, Use Positive Self-Talk

The first thing you need to do when you feel yourself losing control of your feelings, is to tell your mind (the amygdala) and body to stop.

<u>Ask your child:</u> "What's a signal you can say to yourself to stop yourself from reacting without thinking?" "Tell me about your AMYGDALA and how sometimes it can be a pain in the brain. They should have lots to share!

Dear Danville Families,

I hope everyone had a festive and safe Halloween!

Original Works of Art Fundraiser orders are in and everyone can expect to get their items by the second week in December. Thank you to all who participated in this fundraiser!

The PTA is having the Reflections contest again this year. This is a great opportunity for your kids to show off their artistic talents. The theme this year is "Heroes Around Me". Students may submit in any or all of the following categories: visual art, photography, music, dance, video, and story writing. Entries are due Dec. 7th. There has already been information sent home about this exciting program.

We have been working hard as usual in the art room!

Kindergarteners have been learning how to use shapes to make pictures. They are starting a unit on colors. We have talked about the Color Wheel and embarked on mixing two Primary Colors to make a Secondary Color using silly toothbrushes.

The First Graders are working on creating Scarecrows using a variety of materials. They learned about creating multi-media art. They used their creativity to put together patterns and fabrics that suited their scarecrow. We are practicing the proper use of art materials.

The Second Graders are just finishing up their "Day of the Dead" skulls. They focused on symmetry for that lesson. They also created some beautiful clay leaves by pressing real hydrangea leaves into the clay. They learned about clay vocabulary words such as slab, embossing, sculpture, firing and glazing.

The Third Graders finished up a landscape painting of white birch trees. They learned about warm colors and the wet-on-wet water coloring technique. We talked about the principle of Texture when creating the bark on our trees. They are now working on the Element of Form by creating Owls made from Model Magic Clay.

The Fourth Graders learned about the art of Zentangle and created pumpkins decorated with multiple "tangles" or patterns. They are now learning about the art of Henna. They are creating Henna Hand Art using their own hands and clay.

The Fifth Graders finished some spooky fall landscapes. The focus was on the Element of Space, the creation of Silhouettes, the concept of Mood in an artwork, and the process of blending oil pastel colors. Presently, they are learning about the famous New England artist Winslow Homer.

The students learned about a pumpkin's life cycle. They also explored the inside and outside of many gourds using tweezers and magnifying glasses.

Towards the end of the month, the students studied the characteristics of a leave. They learned that all leaves have color under the green that is just waiting to burst out when the temperature and weather conditions are just right!

afternoon each grade 5 class worked on building vehicles. The challenge was to see if they could design a vehicle that would go the fastest. One class used connectors to build and test on a ramp. The other group built robot vehicles and had a team race-off.

of these problems Each challenged students to think of ways to design solutions to their specific problem. Students worked in collaborative teams to consider the challenge and then designed solutions to the problems. The teachers will follow up with a post activity time to help students process through what they learned during this active learning time.
